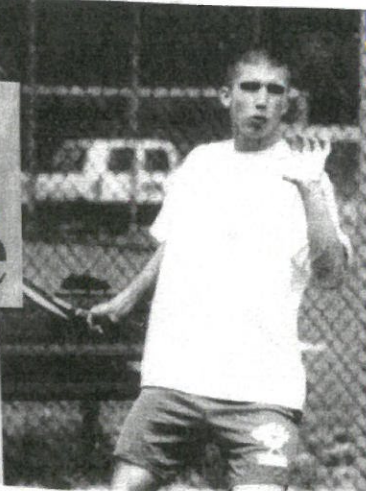

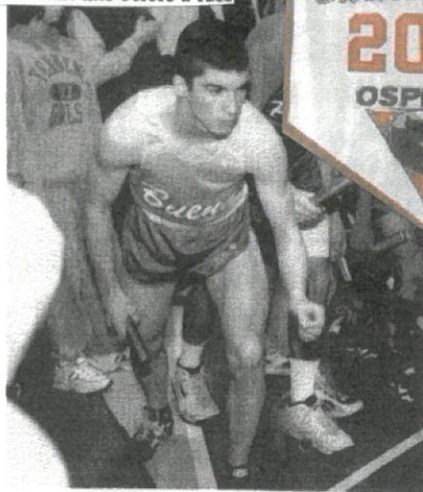

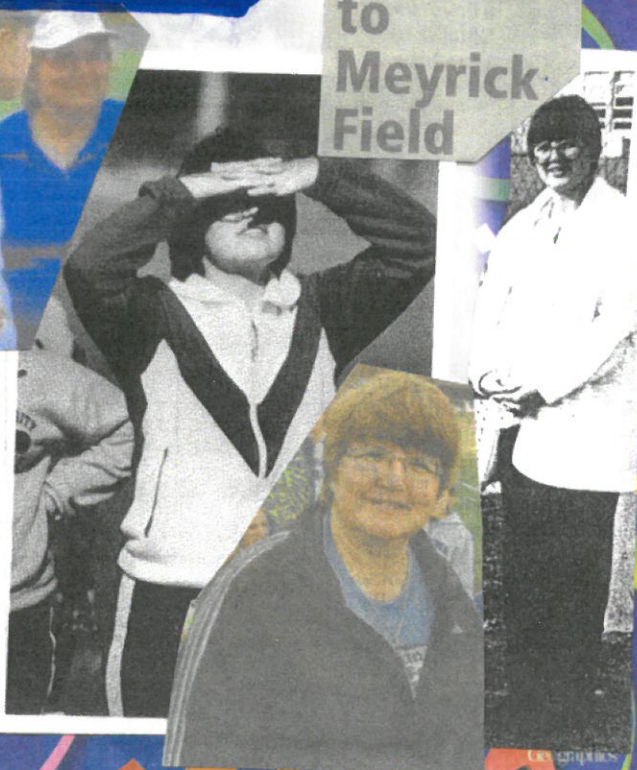

The Chiefs easily beat the competition in the Cape Atlantic League to win the league title. The Chiefs then went on to win the Atlantic County Meet by totaling 36 points, easily besting the remaining teams. The men ran away with the South Jersey Group II Sectional Championship by ousting the previous year's champs, Cinnaminson, by 18 points. The team defeated the Asbury Park Bishops 114-138 to capture the state title. The Chiefs were coached by first year man Paul Thomas, a former cross country state champion.
