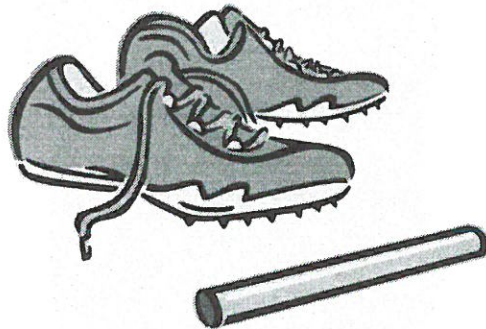

It was time for the 4x200 runners to step up and collect the much needed points for the team's goal.

Mr. Kordos commented, "It was a relief. There was so much pressure to win. I am so proud of this team. We were all happy and excited...we still are. We are still floating from the victory. We are state champions."

A few of Buena's best combine their skills and pit them against the minds of other area school students during South Jersey schools' Academic Bowl.

Mrs. Langley takes on the role of preparing the JV (freshmen sophomores) and Varsity (juniors and seniors) teams for competition.

The competitions for the teams are Jeopardy style, but vary according to skill level. The JV team splits into two groups of six grade level and answer three rounds of questions. The Varsity team juniors and six seniors) are further separated into pairs and put in different rooms for three rounds. The points received for correct answers depends on the difficulty of the question asked at the end of three rounds.

If the JV team wins, they receive a plaque for their school. The Varsity team can receive a prize towards a larger competition held in Washington, D.C.

The JV team competed at Absegami High School on November 18th, while the Varsity team competed at Oakcrest on February 7th. The freshmen on the JV team earned 500 points and the sophomores earned 150. Neither team placed first. 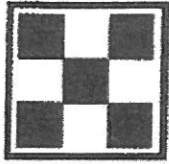
