With almost 800 bird species identifies so far in a relatively small country, Honduras is a birder's paradise. Honduras is the most mountainous country in Central America and connects the northern and southern hemispheres, making it an ideal destination for neotropical migratory species as well as tropical residents. Honduras is a little-known, off-the-beaten path natural paradise, where you still enjoy birding in vast natural spaces without the crowds.

For coffee lovers, Honduras offers an exceptional opportunity to visit coffee farms, learn about different coffee varietals and processing methods, and enjoy on-site tastings with the farmers themselves. Some of the world's finest coffee is grown on the lush mountains of Honduras, and there's a deep sense of pride among the families who cultivate and hand-pick the ripe coffee cherries.

But beyond the aroma of freshly roasted beans, these same landscapes are alive with the songs of tropical birds. Coffee-growing regions such as Copán, Santa Bárbara, Lempira, and La Paz are not only famous for their rich Arabica coffee but also serve as sanctuaries for a wide variety of bird species.

Here, you can start your morning with a cup of locally roasted coffee while spotting motmots, orioles, or even toucans among the shade trees. A visit to a Honduran coffee farm is truly an experience for all your senses, where the flavors of coffee meet the colors and sounds of nature.

Practical Travel Information

Getting to Honduras: Airports & Airlines

Honduras is easily accessible from major U.S. cities, with three (3) international airports offering convenient entry points. The San Pedro Sula (SAP) Airport is the most recommended gateway, providing central access to the country's top destinations such as Pico Bonito, Lake Yojoa and Copán. The Palmerola (XPL) Airport, near Tegucigalpa, the capital city, serves the central and southern regions, while the Roatán (RTB) Airport connects directly with the Caribbean islands.

Here is the list most relevant list of airlines for the US residents. It is important to verify dates, departure cities, and flight frequencies, as these may vary seasonally.

^{*} **Note:** Flight routes, schedules, and frequencies may vary by season, adjustments are common throughout the year. Verify departure cities and travel dates directly with the airline before booking.

Entry Requirements

Standard requirements

- **Passport:** A valid U.S. passport with at least six months of validity is required. Make sure there is enough blank space for entry and exit stamps.
- Visa: A visa is not required for stays of up to 90 days for tourism.
- **Onward/Return Travel:** You must be able to show proof of onward or return travel.
- **Customs Declaration:** You will need to complete the online customs declaration form and present the resulting QR code upon arrival.
- Currency restrictions for entry/exit: Travelers must declare any amount over \$10,000

Special requirements

- **Vaccinations:** If you are traveling from South America or transiting through South America, you must show proof of a Yellow Fever vaccination.
- **Minors:** Children under 21 traveling alone or with only one parent need a notarized, written permission from the absent parent(s). This letter should be apostilled by the U.S. state registrar where the notary is registered.

Honduras Customs Declaration Form

Form must now be completed electronically.

- Use the following link: https://url-shortener.me/8LF7 or the QR code to access the form. Sometimes internet at the airport is slow or not work properly. Please ensure you complete it beforehand.
- One form per family.
- Mandatory for both entering and leaving Honduras.
 Must be completed within 5 days of entry or departure.
- Use the dropdown menu to select English.
- If you have filled out the form in advance, have a screenshot of the QR code ready for the customs agent to scan.



Clothing Recommendations

- Come prepared. Since this is a tropical country, bring your favorite insect repellent.
- Bring breathable clothing, long-sleeved, lightweight shirts.
- Use sturdy / hiking boots.
- Pack rain jacket / windbreaker.
- Cap / hat
- Sunscreen

Other Recommendations

- Select flights to arrive before or at noon.
- Purchase travel insurance in your country that covers all eventualities during your stay.
- We encourage and respect the principles of sustainable tourism. Therefore, we avoid purchasing plastic bottles. Bring your own water bottle to refill, which will be available throughout the trips.
- In must destinations dollars are accepted. Must of our trips includes all services, but you can use dollars for tips or other purchases, just make sure that they are not torn, stained, or damaged. However, you can use ATMs to obtain local currency.

Honduras enjoys a tropical climate that varies by altitude and region, offering travelers year-round opportunities for birding, nature, and cultural exploration. The country's diverse geography — from Caribbean coasts to misty mountains and dry valleys — creates distinct microclimates across its regions.

As an added bonus this location is a naturalist's dream with the possibility of sighting the subspecies of West Indian manatee: the Antillean manatee, American Crocodile, White-headed Capuchin & Mantled Howler Monkeys.




PICO BONITO






COMAYAGUA - LA PAZ VALLEY

The Comayagua–La Paz valley lies in the heart of Honduras, surrounded by gentle mountain ranges and characterized by a warm, semi-arid climate that gives rise to distinctive dry forest ecosystems. This broad intermontane valley forms a fascinating contrast to the country's humid rainforests, offering a mosaic of thorny scrublands, dry tropical forest, and riparian corridors that host a unique bird community adapted to these conditions.
