PRODUCTION CHECKLIST

Make sure *everyone* in the room **easily** hears **everything** that is said, sung, played, and prayed **100%** of the time. With this goal in mind, evaluate your sound system with this foundational check points.

All seats have a quality listening experience and audio coverage. (Try our <u>evaluation tool!)</u>
People can hear what's played by all the instruments.
The sound quality sounds natural, smooth, comfortable, and clear everywhere. (Not harsh, muddy, edgy, and/or uncomfortable.)
The frequencies are balanced. (Or are the highs, mids, or lows out of balance?)
No feedback issues with microphones, including the preaching microphone.
The acoustic noise on stage from instruments and/or monitors is not overpowering the main speaker system.
The drum & percussion volume levels are mixing well with the rest of the worship band.
When the room is silent, how long does it take a singular loud sound in the room to decay? (Does it reverberate in the room for over two seconds?)
All inputs on stage work.
The stage is free from clutter.
No humming and buzzing sounds in the sound system.
No technical issues getting in the way of rehearsal time.
