2018 ANNUAL BISHOP'S APPEAL: The new Bishop's Appeal has already begun. ALITURGICAL DAYS DURING FASTING PERIODS: During fasting periods it is customary for weekdays to be aliturgical, meaning that the Divine Liturgy is specifically not to be celebrated. This is why the daily liturgical schedule for the Phillips Fast is not the same every week.

THE PHILLIPS FAST: Please remember we are preparing ourselves to properly celebrate the Feast of the Nativity of Our Lord, God, and Savior Jesus Christ on December 25th. This time of preparation in the Byzantine Church is known as the Phillips Fast. During this time we will pray the Emmanuel Moleben once a week. This service helps us to prepare ourselves to experience the great joy of welcoming the Creator of the Universe to becoming one of His own to bring about for us eternal salvation. We are also asked to deepen our personal fasting regimen. There are charts in the narthex to make it

easier for one to apply a more strict fasting regimen during this time. The one rule of Byzantine liturgy and spirituality is that nothing should ever be taken away, but we can only add to what we have been given. Please consider adding more fasting, almsgiving, and prayer to your preparation for the Nativity.

MYSTERY OF REPENTANCE AND THE FAST: Catholics are required to confess grave or mortal sins at least once a year, and should also not approach the Eucharist in the state of mortal sin. However, monthly confession is suggested even for those who only have venial sins. The Church suggests that fasting periods are an appropriate time to repent and ask for forgiveness so that the anticipated Feast can be solemnly celebrated and that all may receive the Eucharist. Booklets are available for free so that all can make a proper examination of conscience to discern whether or not serious sins have been committed.

Saint Paul tell us in his first letter to the Corinthians, "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For any one who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself." (1Cor. 11:27-29)
