These can be difficult with pews, but please do not feel unwelcome to enter into the aisles in order to make a full prostration. If one is unable to make a full prostration, then one can make a profound bow. Fr. Lewis will be leading these for anyone who may not be familiar.

## LITURGICAL NOTES

A **bow** is an inclination of the head at the shoulders while making the sign of the cross.

“**To make a great bow or prostration**” means to make the sign of the cross, kneel, and then touch the forehead to the floor. Those who cannot make a full prostration may make a **profound bow**, touching the floor with the fingers and making a sign of the cross on themselves.

**TIME OF REPENTANCE:** The Great Fast is our time for repentance. We are required to confess once a year, and Holy Week is the most appropriate time to do so. This way, we will be fully prepared to experience the joy of the Resurrection. For those anticipating the reception of Holy Anointing on Holy Wednesday, it is important

to be free from mortal sin and to have recently confessed. We will have two priests hearing confessions so that all can be healed.

**LENTEN DONATIONS:** We will participate in the **Baby Bottle Boomerang** as an option for almsgiving outside of the parish during this Great Fast. There is often a complaint about Christians that in being Pro-Life they fight to defend the unborn child, but then seldom offer ways and means to take care of these previously unwanted children when the mothers do decide to bring them to term and allow them life. This is definitely one way in which we can all contribute to Life by offering the financial support that mothers in need require to choose life instead of death. **FASTING REGULATIONS:** Every person who receives Holy Communion and is a subject of the Eparchy of Passaic is obligated to participate in the prescribed Fast. This is: no meat or dairy on Monday, Mar. 4, & Friday, April 19. No meat on all Wednesdays and Fridays of the Great Fast. Of course, Bishop Kurt Burnette and Father Lewis Rabayda encourage everyone to go further in their fasting regimen so that the celebration of Pascha is truly a joy and celebration of not only Jesus' Resurrection, but also our own resurrection with Him! **Fr. Lewis also recommends taking off work on Good and Holy Friday, April 19 to fully enter into a day of prayer.**

**FRIDAY PRESANCTIFIED DIVINE LITURGY AND POTLUCK:** We will celebrate our Final Presanctified Divine Liturgy this Friday followed by a pot-luck dinner.

**APOSTICA OF THE SIXTH MONDAY:**

“Do not condemn me, O Christ,, to the fires of Hades with the rich man who had no mercy for Lazarus; but, here the prayer I offer You with tears; in your love, grant me a drop of water, O God of tenderness and Lord of compassion.”

**FROM THE TYPICON:**

During the sixth week of the Great Fast, we go from the Canon of Lazarus, the poor man abused by the rich, and follow Christ on His way to Bethany to give life to Lazarus, His friend, the promise of resurrection to all. On Friday we conclude the Fast of the Forty Days and begin the Fast of Holy Week. At Vespers, we read the story of Joseph and his brothers. Joseph is a type of Jesus the Messiah, who died and is risen.
