WEEKLY SCHEDULE: We have worked out a more predictable weekday liturgical schedule that may aid weekday attendance. We will offer the Divine Liturgy on Tuesday mornings at 9AM, and Wednesday evenings at 7:30PM. If, however, there are Simple, Solemn, or Days of Precept (Obligation), then those will take precedence, but the “usual” schedule will be adhered too as much as possible.

Bishop Kurt has encouraged the priests of the Eparchy to offer the Divine Office in our parishes daily. This would prove difficult at this point, but we have been offering more services, especially Great Vespers for Solemn and Precept (Obligation) Holydays. The faithful are highly encouraged to avail themselves of these opportunities for prayer and immersion into our Byzantine Tradition.

UNIONTOWN PILGRIMAGE 2019: We are considering hiring transportation to go to the Uniontown Pilgrimage this year. This is an event that is in its 85th year where Byzantine Catholics come from all over the country to pray and socialize with other Byzantine

Catholics. There are several Divine Liturgies, Matins, Akathists, Parastas, children and teen events, and food. There are also dorm style accommodations and camping available on-site for minimal fees. Hotels are also available. If anyone is interested, please see Fr. Lewis or Dcn. Michael for details. If we go, we will go from August 30 to September 2.

NEW ECF YEAR APPROACHING & ADULT EDUCATION: We will soon be taking registration of children for the 2019/2020 ECF year. All parish children are highly encouraged to attend these classes. The more children we have who regularly attend, the more rich the program will be and the more each child will learn as they can share with each-other and encourage one-another in their Byzantine faith. Also, we will be offering Adult Education classes the same time as the ECF classes, so that parents can learn while their children are learning, and we can all be enriched together.

FEAST OF THE DORMITION OF THE THEOTOKOS: We will be gloriously celebrating this very important feast of Precept (Obligation). We will have the Burial Service consisting of Vespers with Matins and the procession with the shroud of Mary. We will then pray the Lamentations and chant the Psalter (the book of Psalms) through the night and then celebrate the Divine Liturgy in the morning at 9AM. We will also have another liturgy on the evening of the 15th at 7:30PM for those who are not able to attend the morning liturgy. We will have the opportunity for people to sign up for the different hours through the night to keep watch (vigil), and to pray the Psalter. This will be an excellent opportunity to detach from the world and truly enter into deep personal prayer. More information to come!

FORMAL TITLES: As we welcome home Deacon Candidate Alex Adekambi from his first summer of Deacon School, it is fitting to now welcome him with a formal title, Deacon Candidate. Deacon Candidate Alex is not ordained to any orders yet, but he has now entered into formal study of theology, and is now under the direction of a Spiritual Director, a Deacon Mentor, and is now obligated to a more rigorous prayer-life. Deacon formation is similar to Seminary Formation except that the everyday challenges and learning are experienced within the context of the parish instead of a closed seminary environment. This is a time of discernment for Deacon Candidate Alex as he prays and asks God to lead him and to teach him. He needs our prayers, and also our respect that is afforded clerics.

Likewise, it is more fitting that we properly address those who have been ordained to Minor and Major Orders as well. As of now, we have Subdeacon John, Father Deacon James, Father Deacon Michael, and Father Lewis. Not only does it offer the proper respect for those who have been found worthy of ordination to the clerical state, but it acknowledges the hard work, countless prayers, and self-sacrifice that these men have offered in order to follow the Will of God for their lives. But more-so, the Office itself, is what is respected. The priest shares in the Priesthood of Jesus Christ, the Deacons serve the Bishop-the Successors of the Apostles, and the Subdeacons likewise serve at the Divine Services. Jesus Christ willed that men be His direct successors and to be His witnesses to minister to His flock. It is a great duty, a great sacrifice, and a great obligation to faithfully follow Jesus Christ. When we address these men with their proper formal title, it reminds them of who they are, the ministry to which they have been called, and encourages them to live lives worthy of that call.

The Code of Canons for the Eastern Churches states: “**Can. 323 §1** Clerics, who are also called sacred ministers, are Christian faithful who, chosen by the competent ecclesiastical authority, by means of a gift of the

Holy Spirit received in sacred ordination, are deputed to be ministers of the Church, participating in the mission and power of Christ the Pastor.

§2. By reason of sacred ordination, by divine institution clerics are distinguished from the other Christian faithful.

Can. 327 If besides bishops, presbyters or deacons, other ministers also, constituted in minor orders and generally called minor clerics, are admitted or instituted for the service of the people of God or to exercise functions of the sacred liturgy, they are governed only by the particular law of the proper Church sui iuris.”
