BLESSING OF VEHICLES: Wheeled vehicles (cars, trucks, bicycles, etc.) will be blessed next Saturday and Sunday, July 20-21, following Divine Liturgies in commemoration of the Feast of St. Elias. Elias was a prophet of the Old Testament who lived in the ninth century before the Coming of Jesus Christ. The Troparion of his feast calls him “a pillar of prophets, and the “second Forerunner of the coming of Christ.” Because, as Scripture tells us, he was taken to heaven in a fiery chariot, the Jewish people felt that he did not die as mortals do and that some day he would return to earth to “restore the tribes of Israel” (Ecclus. 48:10). Icons depicting Elias usually show him in a chariot drawn by fiery horses heading heavenward and his cloak or mantle falling earthward into the outstretched arms of Elisha his companion and disciple, signifying the transfer of his power and authority of a prophet. To learn about Elias and the miraculous events that surrounded him, read Kings I and Kings II.

MEN’S AND WOMEN’S GROUPS TO RESTART IN JULY: Yes, the men’s and women’s groups began during the Great Fast and have not resumed since then. It has been Father Lewis’ intension to resume these groups and we will resume them in July. The firm dates will come next week, but most likely they will be: Men’s July 18, Women’s July 25.

BRAVEHEARTED: We are a men’s therapy group, providing education and support for men to work through a range of concerns. NEW ECF YEAR APPROACHING & ADULT EDUCATION: We will soon be taking registration of children for the 2019/2020 ECF year. All parish children are highly encouraged to attend these classes. The more children we have who regularly attend, the more rich the program will be and the more each child will learn as they can share with each-other and encourage one-another in their Byzantine faith. Also, we will be offering Adult Education classes the same time as the ECF classes, so that parents can learn while their children are learning, and we can all be enriched together.

WEEKLY SCHEDULE: We have worked out a more predictable weekday liturgical schedule that may aid weekday attendance. We will offer the Divine Liturgy on Tuesday mornings at 9AM, and Wednesday evenings at 7:30PM. If, however, there are Simple, Solemn, or Days of Precept (Obligation), then those will take precedence, but the “usual” schedule will be adhered too as much as possible.

Bishop Kurt has encouraged the priests of the Epar- chy to offer the Divine Office in our parishes daily. This would prove difficult at this point, but we have been offering more services, especially Great Vespers for Solemn and Precept (Obligation) Holydays. The faithful are highly encouraged to avail themselves of these opportunities for prayer and immersion into our Byzantine Tradition.

EVAGRIOS THE SOLITARY (345-399AD): ON PRAYER

excerpts from the Philokalia, Vol. 1

73. When the intellect attains prayer that is pure and free from passion, the demons attack no longer with sinister thoughts but with thoughts of what is good. For they suggest to it an illusion of God's glory in a form pleasing to the senses, so as to make it think that it has realized the final aim of prayer. A man who possesses spiritual knowledge has said that this illusion results from the passion of self-esteem and from the demon's touch on a certain area of the brain.

74. I think that the demon, by touching this area, changes the light surrounding the intellect as he likes. In this way he uses the passion of self-esteem to stir up in the intellect a thought which fatuously attributes form and location to divine and principal knowledge. Not being disturbed by impure and carnal passions, but supposing itself to be in a state of purity, the intellect imagines that there is no longer any adverse energy within it. It then mistakes for a divine manifestation the appearance produced in it by the demon, who cunningly manipulates the brain and converts the light surrounding the intellect into a form, as we have described.

UNIONTOWN PILGRIMAGE 2019: We are considering hiring transportation to go to the Uniontown Pilgrimage this year. This is an event that is in its 85th year where Byzantine Catholics come from all over the country to pray and socialize with other Byzantine Catholics. There are several Divine Liturgies, Matins, Akathists, Parastas, children and teen events, and food. There are also dorm style accommodations and camping available on-site for minimal fees.
