ALL-SOULS SATURDAYS: In the Byzantine Tradition there are 5 days in the liturgical year specifically set aside to pray for the repose of the souls of the faithful departed. They coincide with the Great Fast, and the first Saturday is on February 15 at 10AM. These liturgies are for the departed, sung with the funeral melodies in the green pew book, with a Panachida prayed at the end, where the clergy read through every name supplied by each family. MEATFARE AND CHEESEFARE SUNDAYS: Meatfare Sunday is the last day we eat meat, if we choose to adhere to the traditional fasting regulations. Cheesefare Sunday is also known as Forgiveness Sunday. This day is the last day to eat dairy products if one is adhering to the traditional fast. But it is also a day in which we forgive one another so that we can enter into the Great Fast with clean consciences. We will celebrate the traditional Forgiveness Vespers after the luncheon with the service of mutual forgiveness. Please consider attending this service that transitions from Sunday into the Great Fast.

FEAST OF THE MEETING IN THE TEMPLE: This is a Solemn Feast, which happens to fall on a Sunday this year, because the feast is fixed, meaning that it is always celebrated on Feb. 2. There are many reasons for this feast; it is when Mary offers a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons for her purification after giving birth, and, for Jesus to be presented in the temple, and recognized as the Christ by both the Priest Simeon, and Prophetess Anna.
