CONFESSION AVAILABLE: Fr. Lewis will be available for confession at almost anytime in the near future. Fr. Lewis will make arrangements to hear confessions in accordance with proper social distancing, and/or confessions may be heard outside.

NEW CAMERAS ARRIVED! Our new permanent Livestream cameras arrived last week. We will only be using one of the cameras for our current streams, but when we move back inside for services, we will have two cameras which will give some variety for those watching at home and in the narthex. In time, we will also be getting a TV and speakers for the narthex, so that those who wish to take their children into the narthex may do so and not miss any of the liturgy. As many of you know, this project has been on our minds.

FURTHER DISPENSATION OF OBLIGATION AND OUTDOOR LITURGY: Bishop Kurt has extended the dispensation from attending the Sunday Divine Liturgy for all of the faithful of the Eparchy of Passaic through May 31. Those who feel it is not yet safe for them to be in public may continue to stay at home. However, those who are prepared are encouraged to participate in the outdoor Divine Liturgy on Sunday.

In case of inclement weather for an upcoming Outdoor Sunday liturgy, we may email the parish on Saturday morning if the weather is looking better for Saturday night at 5:30PM than it is on Sunday morning. So, please be vigilant of the weather and check your email. **SERVICES THIS WEEK:** We will be moving inside for four services this week. Please keep in mind that the expected social distancing guidelines will be in place, and that books will continue to not be available. Please bring your simple copy of the Divine Liturgy that was offered on Sunday. Keep in mind that Thursday is a Holyday of Obligation: Ascension. Divine Liturgy will be offered twice that day. If we reach capacity, we reserve the right to ask others to not stay for the service. We apologize for this inconvenience. Masks are encouraged for those who may be vulnerable.

THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD! The Ascension of Our Lord is a Holyday of Obligation. However, because of world events, current obligations have been dispensed by Bishop Kurt for subjects of the Eparchy of Passaic, as well as by the authorities in the Archdiocese of Atlanta. This feast-day commemorates a most glorious event, when, after taking on human flesh, our Lord and Creator brought that flesh into hades, and rose up to heaven only to return here to earth. After completing His earthly ministry, He then took that same flesh, now glorified, into heaven permanently, thus, bringing all of humanity up to heaven with Him, and making this journey possible for each one who believes in Him, who eats His Flesh, and who enacts His will in their lives. Glory to your Ascension, O Lord!

VIGIL DIVINE LITURGY: Next Saturday, we will resume our usual Saturday evening Divine Liturgy inside. However, as mentioned before, this liturgy will be transitioned to the proper Vigil Divine Liturgy. This means that Liturgy will begin with Vespers, and then move into the Divine Liturgy at the Thrice Holy Hymn before the Liturgy of the Word. We will discuss how this service is celebrated before the service begins.
