As you can imagine, there will need to be a lot of training involved with this new ministry, and some knowledge or familiarity of the Divine Liturgy will be helpful. On the Dispensation of Obligation: Bishop Kurt stated in his letter of May 13, which is posted on our website: "'Should I stay home from church, even though the church is open? In his chapter on the Holy Eucharist, St. Paul says, 'Let each one examine himself.' If you think you are contagious, or if you think you are in danger, you are dispensed from any

obligations to attend. Please stay home if you do not feel well." This means that we have returned to our "normal" dispensations of attending holydays of obligation. Those who are vulnerable or who are sick are still dispensed from their obligation, but all others are encouraged to resume attendance. We are taking steps to make sure attending liturgy is safe.

THE FEAST OF SAINTS PETER & PAUL: This feast is a Holyday of Obligation in the Byzantine Church. Peter, the Rock, was chosen by Christ to lead His One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church. And Paul, being one of the Christian Sect's greatest enemies, became one of Jesus' most influential evangelizes. These two pillars of humanity and the Church are celebrated with great attention on this day, as they are our original human Father's the in the faith, that spread to all of humanity what they were given by Christ Himself.
