SUNDAY 1PM DIVINE LITURGY TO CEASE: Beginning on Sunday, Nov. 1, we will no longer offer the 1PM Divine Liturgy for the purposes of allowing for more social distancing. Our attendance has dropped at both Sunday Liturgies for a month now, and we feel it is time to bring the congregation back together for a single Sunday Liturgy. We will have plenty of room both in the nave and in the narthex to accommodate our current numbers. If, however, one would prefer more distance, the Saturday evening Vigil Liturgy offers the most social distancing.

PICNIC ON SUNDAY NOV. 1: Because of current events, we had not planned our annual Founder's Day Picnic. However, some parishioners were eager to arrange a social gathering whatever it might be called. Is it the Founder's Day Picnic? I don't know. But it will be a picnic and good times may be had by all. The parish will supply the main meat dishes with buns and drinks. Those who would like to attend are asked to fill out the sign up sheet in the narthex, or contact the parish office with their attendance and what possible dish they will bring. You may want to bring your own camping **chair to sit by the fire!** The food will be setup outside underneath a canopy, and electricity may not be available, so please keep this in mind when considering what food to bring. We will be grilling, have a campfire, and enjoy each-other's good company on our own parish grounds.

2020 Annual Bishop's Appeal: Yes, it is that time again where we are asked to support the work of the Eparchy of Passaic. The Eparchy is responsible for many functions of our church and relies on Cathedtraticum (8% tax of weekly collections from each parish), and this direct annual Appeal. Our parish goal is the same as last year at \$10,800. However, if we reach or exceed our goal, the parish will receive a rebate of 40% of that total after the campaign has concluded. Last year, we exceeded our goal and received back \$4,960!

It is suggested that if each family contributes \$200, then we will meet our goal. Also, similar to last year, a parishioner would like to challenge us all by donating \$50 for a minimum donation of \$75! This will undoubtedly aid us in our goal!

HELP NEEDED FOR PICNIC AREA: We will be asking the Grounds Cleaning Crew if they can assume some extra duties to help prepare our picnic area for Nov.

1. We will have a picnic setup day and minor grounds work on Saturday, Oct. 31. We really need a lot of help to get this done as there are a lot of tasks, please let Fr. Lewis know if you are able to join us and help.

- Finish cleaning up ground cover around fire pit area for about 8-10' radius
- Home Depot: buy 2 4"x4"x10' landscape timbers for base of wood pile; buy 3 8"x8" (or something like that) x4' huge landscape timbers to replace rotten ones
- Clear area around cement grill, possibly put stone, or crush and run around this area, clean-out grill to desired depth

- Fix loose nails (pound in or remove) from wooden platform banister
- Complete raking/mulching ground cover near picnic tables to include larger area
- Move picnic tables from cement pad into woods areas
- Bring folding tables from choir loft out and onto cement pad, and some on wooden platform, set up folding chairs
- Erect canopy over wooden platform
- Gather large amount of firewood, and stack on wood pile: kindling, and all sizes of wood to burn
- Spread new pine straw around front entrance landscaping
- Use leave blower for entire property to clear area of debris
