This is an excellent idea! But the first Sunday in December will be our Saint Nicholas event, so we should resume the campfire Sunday event in January.

**2020 ANNUAL BISHOP'S APPEAL:** Yes, it is that time again where we are asked to support the work of the Eparchy of Passaic. The Eparchy is responsible for many

functions of our church and relies on Cathedtraticum (8% tax of weekly collections from each parish), and this direct annual Appeal. Our parish goal is the same as last year at \$10,800. However, if we reach or exceed our goal, the parish will receive a rebate of 40% of that total after the campaign has concluded. Last year, we exceeded our goal and received back \$4,960! It is suggested that if each family contributes \$200, then we will meet our goal. Also, similar to last year, a parishioner would like to challenge us all by donating \$50 for a minimum donation of \$75! This will undoubtedly aid us in our goal!
