CONGRATULATIONS TO READER ALEX! AXIOS! HE IS WORTHY! Our Deacon Candidate Alex Adekambi is being tonsured and ordained by Bishop Kurt through the Minor Orders—which are: Candle Bearer, Cantor, and Reader—on Sunday Afternoon during the St. Nicholas Pilgrimage at the Carpathian Village in Canadensis, PA. The next Minor Order is Subdeacon, and then, by the Grace of God, Alex will be elevated to the Major Order of the Diaconate. When Alex returns, his correct title will be "Reader Alex."

Candle Bearer is the office of what we currently know as Altar Server. Cantor is the one who leads the faithful in melody during the divine services. And Reader, is the one who chants the Epistle. In the early church, one may not perform any of these functions unless they underwent much discernment and study in preparation, and be found worthy by their bishop of receiving ordination.

DORMITION FAST: The Typicon states, "The traditional rule for the Dormition Fast is strict abstinence from August 1 to 14, with the usual mitigations (wine and oil) for Saturday and Sunday and the Feast of the Transfiguration (Aug 6). It is, therefore, observed as the Great Fast. the Ruthenian Metropolia has identified this period as a penitential season (Canon 880, § 2). The observance of this fast is voluntary." As stated, this is a voluntary fast, so whatever one may decide to add to their normal fasting regimen would be considered laudable.

ANNUAL ALL-NIGHT VIGIL IN HONOR OF THE DORMITION OF THE THEOTOKOS: As we have for the past few years, we will celebrate in full liturgical fashion this glorious feast and Holyday of Obligation:



- We will have a liturgical All-Night Vigil on Aug. 14 beginning at 7:30PM. This will include Great Vespers with Litija and Matins with a candlelight procession with the burial shroud of the Theotokos.
- We will have an opportunity for the faithful to pray the Psalms and other private devotions through the night until the morning services. Please use the SignUpGenius to secure your hour. An off-duty Roswell Police Officer will be on the grounds to assure safety.
- We will celebrate the Akathist in Honor of the Dormition of the Theotokos on Aug. 15 at 11AM
- Divine Liturgy will be at 12NOON and then 6:30PM
