CATECHETICAL SUNDAY: Sunday, September 11, will be the beginning of our Eastern Catholic Formation program for the 2022/2023 academic year.

BEGINNING OF THE CHURCH YEAR: September 1st is the beginning of the Church Year. One will notice, that in prayer books and our Pew Book, that August is the end of the Fixed Feastday Cycle, and that it restarts

again in September. Please see the Light of the East handout for more information.

PAVILION PROJECT UPDATE: *Our architect has secured engineers for our project, and has given us an estimate of 2-3 weeks for them to complete their work. After they have reviewed the plans, made adjustments, and affixed their appropriate stamps, our architect will then resubmit the plans to Roswell. Roswell usually takes 1-2 weeks to review, and we should then be supplied with the appropriate permits. When we receive the permits, they will be submitted to the Eparchy of Passaic for approval, and we will then be able to begin construction.* Upon issuance of the permits, we will then submit to the parish an updated estimate of the project cost and a current balance sheet. There may be other landscaping projects to be completed at the same time, we will keep you informed as these details are finalized.

FEAST OF THE BEHEADING OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST: The elements of this feast are mentioned in all three Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, & Luke), and has been celebrated since the 4th Century. By tradition, a strict fast is observed on this day, but is not required in the Metropolia of Pittsburgh (our Metropolia to which our Eparchy belongs). However, Bishop Kurt encourages the faithful to participate more deeply in the traditions of our faith. Some additional local traditions also include not eating foods from a plate, or anything in the form of a head, such as cabbage, lettuce, apples, etc. We will celebrate the Divine Liturgy on this day.
