#### New Lay Ministries to Begin at Epiphany:

St. Basil said Jesus "shall come in His glory as Judge of all, to render to each according to his deeds." The purpose of the two new lay ministries is to provide an opportunity for the laity of Epiphany to perform good works for our brothers & sisters (fellow parishioners) in Christ. The first, the Bethany Ministry, provides aid to those in need because they are sick, home bound or struggling financially; to provide food, drink or just to sit and have a chat. Similarly, the Lazarus Ministry provides comfort & prayer to those grieving. Volunteers in Lazarus may also provide practical assistance such as preparing meals, helping coordinate with the pastor & funeral home, or simply running errands. There will not be regular meetings nor regular commitment of time. We will have some meetings in the beginning to explain how the programs work and get them started.
