Welcome to our parish!

We are glad that you have chosen to participate in the Divine Liturgy with us today and we pray that it has been a spiritually nourishing experience. If you would like to register as a parishioner or if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask.

The Mysteries (Sacraments) of the Church are available for all Baptized Catholics in Good Standing. This means that a Catholic attends Divine Liturgy on Sundays and Holydays of Obligation, utilizes the Mystery of Repentance at least once a year, receives the Eucharist at least once a year, observes the church’s penitential seasons and fasting regulations to include abstaining from meat or an equivalent penance on all Fridays except when mitigated, supports the Church in Her temporal needs through offering of time, talent, and treasure, and believes the Church’s teachings on faith and morals.

***2022 ANNUAL BISHOP'S APPEAL:** So far, 25 families have contributed \$10,695 towards our goal of \$10,800! If we reach or exceed our goal, the parish will receive a rebate of 40% of that total after the campaign has concluded.

CHEESEFARE PICNIC: We will again have pot-luck picnics on two Sundays in February. The Cheesefare picnic will be on Feb. 19, and all are invited to bring their favorite dairy dishes (no meat allowed).

Also, after the picnic, we will then celebrate the Forgiveness Vespers of Cheesefare Sunday, where all will be invited to forgive their fellow parishioners, so that we can begin the Fast with a clean conscience and a pure heart.

CHEESEFARE WEEK: Again, if one is adhering to the traditional fast, then during the week of cheesefare (Feb. 12-Feb. 19), we should be cleaning out our refrigerator of the dairy products we have, so there will be none left by the evening of Feb. 19, Cheesefare Sunday.

PAVILION PROJECT UPDATE: Quotes are being procured for some work involved in the project based on survey questions. Survey will be approved after quotes received. There will be a meeting with the parish before we enter into the final stages of this project, as it has grown in size and will cover many sections of the property based on Roswell's requirements.

A NOTE ON ALITURGICAL DAYS: The Great Fast officially begins on Clean Monday, Feb. 20. From the Typicon: "All days of the Great Fast are days of Alleluia [alituricals days], unless otherwise noted." This means that they are days on which we cannot "celebrate" the Divine Liturgy. However, we do have the opportunity to celebrate the Divine Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts, or as some call it, the Divine Liturgy of St. Gregory, so that we can still be fed with the Bread of Life on our journey through the Great Fast.

One theme present in the parable of the Sheep and the Goats is the assurance of a final judgment. The peoples of the world will be judged by Jesus Christ according to how they interacted with the least of their brethren. However, even though we are sinful, we call upon the incredible mercy of God to forgive us our sins.

APOSTICA OF VESPERS

T8 Glory: Alas! O my darkened soul, how long will you persist in sin? How long will you lie in laziness? Why do you not think of the dreadful hour of death? Do you not fear the awesome judgment seat of the Savior? How will you defend yourself? How will you be vindicated? Your works are there to convict you, and your actions witness against you. Moreover, time is growing short, O my soul; hasten and cry out in faith: I have sinned, O Lord, I have sinned: but I know your love and your mercy. O Good Shepherd, in your goodness, do not deprive me of a place at your right hand.

Now and ever: O Virgin, you have never known wedlock, yet you conceived God in the flesh in a manner which words can never describe. You thus became the Mother of God on high. O Immaculate Lady, receive the supplication of your servants and grant us the cleansing of our sins. Accept now our prayers and beseech God to save all of us.

KONTAKION

When you come to the earth in glory, O God, and the universe trembles and a river of fire flows before your judgment seat and the books are opened and everything hidden is revealed, deliver me then from the unquenchable fire and make me worthy to stand at your right hand, O most righteous Judge.

IKOS OF MATINS

When I think of your fearful judgment and the day of your justice, O Lord of goodness, I tremble with fear; for my conscience accuses me. When You shall be seated upon the throne to ring the entire world before You in trial, no one will be able to deny sins; for truth shall triumph and no one will dare dispute. The fires of Hades will crackle and sinners grind their teeth. But You, O Lord, have mercy on me and spare me, O righteous Judge.

HYMN OF LIGHT OF MATINS

As I think about the day of your fearful judgment and your ineffable glory, O Lord, I tremble with fright, and in fear I cry out: When You come upon the earth in your divine glory, O Christ, to judge the whole world, spare me and deliver me from punishment, O Master, and count me worthy to stand at your right hand.

Glory: Behold, the day of the Lord almighty is coming. Who can bear the terror of his presence? It is a day of wrath and a burning furnace, when the Judge shall be seated to render to each as our deeds deserve.

Now and ever: I consider the hour of judgment and your dreadful coming, O Lord and Lover of Mankind; and in my distress, I tremble and cry out to You: O Judge who alone are merciful, guide me back to You and accept me, through the prayers of the Mother of God.



Fasting Regulations for the Great Fast

EPARCHIAL REGULATIONS: All who receive Communion in the Eparchy of Passaic are required to abstain from meat on Wednesdays and Fridays of the Great Fast—there is no alternative penance. All adults who receive Communion in the Eparchy of Passaic are required to abstain from meat, eggs, and milk products on the first day of The Fast, Monday, Feb. 20, and on Great and Holy Friday, April 7.

FROM THE TYPICON (A GUIDEBOOK FOR THE CELEBRATION OF THE LITURGY AND DIVINE OFFICE): “In the Great Fast, abstinence from meat, fish, dairy products, alcohol and foods cooked in oil was prescribed for all days, except days of mitigation. All Saturdays and Sundays, February 24, March 9, Wednesday to Friday of the Fifth Week, the Prefestive Day and Leave-taking of Annunciation were mitigations for wine and oil. The Feast of the Annunciation (March 25) and Palm Sunday were general mitigations. The Ruthenian Metropolia prescribes strict abstinence (from meat and dairy products) on the First Monday of the Great Fast and on Good Friday,

and abstinence from meat on all Wednesdays and Fridays.”

DISPENSATION: Pastors and Administrators may, for a just cause, grant to the individual faithful and to individual families, dispensations or commutations of the fasting rules into other pious practices. Those who are pregnant or nursing, and those in advanced age may seek dispensations for health reasons.

POSSIBLE FASTING REGIMINES: Enclosed are a variety of fasting possibilities for those who seek the spiritual benefit of challenging themselves to a deeper participation in the Great Fast. One can start simple and increase the difficulty as the Fast progresses. **Either way, all are encouraged to do more than the minimum, except the elderly, pregnant, small children, and those with special medical issues.**

Special Notes

The tradition also suggests that fish with a backbone is considered flesh and meat, however, any type of shellfish is permitted all days of the fast. It is also the tradition that both wine and oil are abstained from as well; this may have been because of their storage in animal skins, but either way, alcohol is good to abstain from during the Great Fast.
