

It has been suggested that the bulletin address questions the faithful may have about the different aspects of our liturgy and our expression of the Catholic Faith. So, anyone is encouraged to ask questions, and Fr. Lewis will answer them to the best of his ability, and research what is outside of his ability. There have been some example questions already submitted, which we will address in the bulletin as time goes by.

Question: What is meant by "particular church" or *sui iuris*?

Answer: *Sui Iuris* is Latin for "of one's own rite." This phrase refers to the designation of each "particular church," or what we call, a "self-governing" church. There are a total of 24 self-governing churches within the Catholic Communion. In recent decades the term Rite—referring to the many different traditions in communion with each-other, and in communion with the Pope of Rome, hence, Catholic Churches—is being phased-out and replaced with the term Church. So, Church and Rite refer to the same organized body of people.

Each Church has it's own hierarchical structure which governs It independently of each other Catholic Church/Rite, while recognizing the Pope of Rome as the ultimate authority. Some Churches are headed by a Patriarch, which is the highest level of authority similar to the Pope of Rome. For all of history, another title for the Pope of Rome was, The Patriarch of the West. However, to the displeasure of the Orthodox, this title was removed in the past few decades with the recognition that the Roman Church is no longer only situated in the Western World, but that it is in fact in each hemisphere. But the Patriarch of the West is considered The First Among Equals, meaning, he has the place of preference in all authority among his brother patriarchs and bishops because he is the successor of Saint Peter. But each patriarch may function as he sees fit within his jurisdiction, or "particular church."

Our, "particular church" in the United States is *sui iuris*/self-governing and is led by our Metropolitain Archbishop of Pittsburgh. We have four "eparchys"(diocese) in the United States: The Metropolia of Pittsburgh, PA, Eparchy of Passaic, NJ, Eparchy of Parma, OH, and the Eparchy of the Protection of the Mother of God in Phoenix, AZ. We are the subjects of the Eparchy of Passiac, NJ led by Bishop Kurt Burnette.

There are two general codes of Cannon Law: The Code of Canons of the Catholic Church, and the Code of Canons of the Eastern Churches. Each *sui iuris* church may promulgate its own additions or clarifications to Cannon Law, which would be titled, "particular law," and would only be enforceable for those who are ascribed to, or are the proper subjects of that "particular church."

If one discerns that they would like to formally "change Rites," or "change Churches," it means that they would formally petition the bishop of the Church they would like to change to, and the bishop of the Church they formally belong to, must release them to the other bishop. It is then that one will be under the authority of their new bishop, and all applicable canon, and particular law. Each Church can also adjust their own Holydays of Obligation and make other changes to their liturgy and other customs. However, all changes must be approved by the appropriate Roman Office at the Vatican.
