\*Apostles Fast: The Peter & Paul Fast begins Sunday evening (5/26) and lasts until June 28. The Typikon prescribes strict abstinence (no meat or diary) on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, with a mitigation (wine and oil) on Tuesdays and Thrusdays. The Ruthenian Metropolia has identified this period as a pentitential season. This fast is not necessary to engage with under pain of sin, but may be observed voluntarily.

# "Why Do Byzantine Catholics Do That?"

It has been suggested that the bulletin address questions the faithful may have about the different aspects of our liturgy and our expression of the Catholic Faith. So, anyone is encouraged to ask questions, and Fr. Lewis will answer them to the best of his ability, and research what is outside of his ability. There have been some example questions already submitted, which we will address in the bulletin as time goes by.

Comment about last week's Q & A: Dcn. John Reed brought to my attention that Pope Francis has reinstated the historical title "Patriarch of the West" to the list of titles appropriate for the Pope of Rome. It was Pope Benedict XVI who removed the title in 2006, a title which came into use in 642 by Pope Theodore.

Q: Please explain the difference between a permanent deacon and a transitional deacon?

A: In the Roman Church there is a distinction between the states of the Diaconate, however, in the Byzantine Tradition there is not. A Transitional Deacon is a celibate who is engaged in seminary formation with the intention of eventually being ordained to the Priesthood. While a Permanent Deacon is usually a married man who has discerned a call to serve the Church in a more profound way and goes through a program of education and formation. However, this program of education is not as comprehensive as the full seminary tract, and an accredited degree is not granted for academic work completed.

In the Byzantine Tradition, there is no distinction between the states of the Diaconate. Married men may be admitted to the Office of the Priesthood, so there is no need to make a distinction of how far up the hierarchical chain (to the order of the priesthood) one may be ordained. However, if a deacon discerns further that God is calling him to the Office of the Priesthood, then his bishop may send him for formal education and seminary formation. The ordination Rites are the same.

The succession of Holy Orders in the Byzantine Ruthenian Metropolia are as follows:

Minor Orders

Candle Bearer Reader/Cantor Subdeacon

Major Orders

Deacon Priest Archpriest/Archimandrite Bishop

The Diaconate is considered a Major Order and is a permanent state in life. If a man discerns marriage and major orders, one must be married before they are ordained into major orders. At this point, if, God forbid, a man loose his wife to death or separation, he may not engage in another marriage. In our tradition, we refer to deacons as, Father Deacon, recognizing their status as major clerics.

**FLOAT DOWN THE RIVER FOR FATHER'S DAY:** A whole day of fun!!! Celebrate Father's Day with a Float Down the Cartecay River and enjoy a day of picnicking ending with the Saturday evening Divine Liturgy at Gina & Ken's in Ellijay on June 15, with a rain date of June 22. **This Saturday evening liturgy WILL replace our usual Saturday evening liturgy** on this day, so please plan appropriately.

General Info: The community is gated and you will need the access code #1125 to enter. One can float on the river before or after lunch. There will be activities for children that can't float on the river at the house. We will be grilling burgers and dogs but **bringing a covered dish is strongly encouraged.** If you would like alcohol or beer, please BYOB. Water, lemonade and ice tea will be provided. We will have last call for food around 4PM to allow a 1hour fast before Divine Liturgy at 5PM.

What to expect on the River: Rafts will be provided and you can "put in" at the house and Gina & Ken will pick everyone up at the exit at Blackberry Falls. The Float should last about 1 1/2 hours. It's an easy float, but there are some obstacles. It's pretty shallow unless there has been a lot of rain. The few rapids that you will encounter are easy and fun so don't worry about that being a danger...If Gina can do it, anyone can do it....Just enjoy the ride.
