Footsteps of Saint Paul Trip: If you were considering to attend the wonderful Pilgrimage to Greece & Turkey this September, then you have one more week to sign up if you have not yet done so. The trip currently has around 16-17 attendees. donations for 4 new complete sets of Altar Linens and matching server vestments as well as clergy vestments. However, before we order these vestments, we have been attempting to procure new custom side tables for the altar: the Proscomedia Table (Table of Preparation on the North or Left side of the Altar), and the Diaconicon (Deacon Table, on the South or Right side of the altar). We currently only have one table which was made along with the original Altar, the other side table is not original. The new tables will be identical, higher, and contain 6 drawers each, which will assist us in our storage issues, and relieve some of the clutter in the Sacristy. Two vendors we have been trying to work with have not made good on the project, so we will continue to achieve satisfaction. These tables need to be completed first, so our measurements for altar linens are accurate.
