FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE CROSS: In 325 A.D., after the persecutions against the Christians had just ended, Christians were free to express themselves and to adorn their places of worship with symbols of the faith–like the cross. Empress Helen, a devout Christian and the mother of Emperor Constantine the Great, went to Jerusalem to retrieve the true cross. After a futile search, the Empress was attracted by the scent of basil in the area where Jesus had been put to

death. She ordered an excavation and three crosses were unearthed. A paralyzed person was positioned on each of the crosses to determine the cross upon which Christ had died. When he was placed on the true cross, the person recovered miraculously and walked. This is traditionally a day of strict fast, but only abstinence from meat is required.
