PHILIP’S FAST: According to the forty-day tradition,
the Philip’s Fast in preparation for Christmas began on
Saturday November 15 and goes to Christmas Eve. The
Ruthenian Metropolia has identified this period as a
penitential season (Canon 880, § 2). This fast **may be
observed voluntarily**, partially or in its entirety.

CHURCH DECORATING DAY: We will decorate the church for the Feast of the Nativity on Saturday, Dec. 6th, St. Nicholas Day. On Friday 12/05 there will be Great Vespers for the feast, and on Saturday 12/06 there will be a 9AM Divine Liturgy. Anyone who might be able to volunteer to help set up is asked to stick around after the Saturday morning liturgy. Snacks will be provided!

SAINT NICHOLAS CELEBRATION: This year, the parishioners of St. John Melkite Church will join us for the St. Nicholas Celebration on Sunday Dec. 7. After our liturgy here at Epiphany, we will go to the Roswell Recreation Center, 9000 Fouts Road, Roswell, GA 30076. Please consider bringing your favorite holiday dishes. There will be fun for all ages.

OFFICE OF HOLY OIL (ANOINTING): As we have done in the past year, we will again join our two Atlanta Byzantine Parishes to celebrate the Office of Holy Oil (Anointing of the Sick) for this fasting period, The Phillip's Fast. This time, we will join St. John Chrysostom Melkite Catholic Church at 1428 Ponce de Leon Ave. NE, Atlanta, GA, at 7PM on Friday, December 19.

2025 ANNUAL BISHOPS APPEAL: The Eparchy of Passaic's annual appeal has begun. Our goal is the same as the last few years, \$10,800. If we reach our goal by June 1 2026, we will receive a 40% rebate. We have met this goal 5 years running, so giving to

the Bishop's Appeal is giving to our parish! Anyone who has not received an envelope in the mail for the Bishop's Appeal that would like one can pick one up in the narthex on the shelf next to the office door. **So far 9 families have donated a total of \$3,000!**

LOG PILE AND CONSTRUCTION CAUTION: Please keep distance away from the log pile at the back of the parish property and the big equipment down the hill. The logs are precarious and not suitable for climbing or playing. There may also be sharp and dangerous tools nearby. We are using that lumber to build benches and other improvements to the property, so be on the lookout for those in the coming weeks!

NEW SHED COMING SOON: In the next couple of months we are having a new shed installed at the back of the property. This will help us store all of our decorations, lawn care equipment, and tools so we can declutter the narthex and choir loft! In your offertory envelopes you should see Capital Improvement envelopes as well. Those can be used to give toward this and other improvement projects that we have coming over the next several months.

THANKSGIVING DAY: The Typicon states that Thursday, Thanksgiving Day, is a general mitigation from the fast, so no fasting is necessary on this day. Also, each year, the bishops of the United States offer a dispensation from abstinence from meat on the Friday after Thanksgiving.
