1700TH ANNIVERSARY OF FIRST ECUMENICAL

COUNCIL: On May 20th, the Christian world commemorated the 1700th anniversary of the opening of the First Ecumenical Council, held in Nicea (now Iznik, Turkey) in 325! May we live according to the Truth professed!

THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD: Thursday, May 29 is the Holyday of Obligation of the Ascension of Our Lord, God, and Savior Jesus Christ. We will celebrate Great Vespers the evening before, and will offer two liturgies on the day of the feast so the faithful can attend

when their schedules allow. This feast marks the end of the Paschal season, as we celebrate Christ Ascending Bodily into Heaven. We still omit the prayer to the Holy Spirit, "Heavenly King, Comforter..." until it is gloriously reintroduced on Pentecost Sunday Vespers.

—We will offer small snacks after the Pentecost Sunday Liturgy—June 8—to fortify our bodies to return to the church to celebrate the beautiful Kneeling Vespers on the Day of the Holy Spirit. So, please plan on attending this very important liturgical celebration.

Those seeking Sacramental Marriage should contact the parish 1 year in advance.
