SOLEMN FEASTDAY: Saturday, November 8th is the Solemn Feast of the Synaxis of the Archangel Michael and All the Angelic Powers.

Christian Tradition assigns to St. Michael four offices:

- 1) *to fight against Satan*
- 2) *to rescue the souls of the faithful from the power of the devil*
- 3) *to be the champion of God's people*
- 4) *to summon men's souls from the earth and bring them to judgment.*

St. Basil and other Greek Fathers place St. Michael over all the angels, calling him "Archangel." In the liturgy he is often called "Archistrategos—highest general." Oh Holy Archangel Michael, defend us in battle...

2025 ANNUAL BISHOPS APPEAL: The Eparchy of Passaic's annual appeal has begun. Our goal is \$10,800. If we reach our goal by June 1st 2026, we will receive a 40% rebate. We have met this goal 5 years running, so giving to the Bishop's Appeal is giving to our parish! Anyone who has not received an envelope in the mail for the Bishop's Appeal that would like one can pick one up in the narthex on the shelf next to the office door.

THE PILGRIM VOCATION ICON PROGRAM: You may have noticed a new icon on the tetrapod, The Pilgrim Vocation Icon. This is part of a traveling icon program that is meant to encourage us to pray for vocations more fervently. Each week, the icon is taken by a household in the parish. Those who accept the icon agree to pray during that time for religious and priestly vocations. Everyone in the parish is invited and encouraged to have this icon in their home for one week, now through mid January. Prayer booklets will be provided to those who will be taking the icon home each week. Each Sunday liturgy for the next few months will have additional petitions for vocations, and at the end of each Sunday liturgy just before the dismissal, the icon will be passed on to the next household on the list. It will then be prayed with by that household for the entire week, and will be returned to the tetrapod the following Sunday before liturgy. **All slots have been filled!**

This means that a Catholic attends Divine Liturgy on Sundays and Holydays of Obligation, utilizes the Mystery of Repentance at least once a year, receives the Eucharist at least once a year, observes the church's penitential seasons and fasting regulations to include abstaining from meat or an equivalent penance on all Fridays except when mitigated, supports the Church in her temporal needs through offering of time, talent, and treasure, and believes the Church's teachings on faith and morals. Those seeking Sacramental Marriage should contact the parish 1 year in advance.
