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Alarmingly Low Literacy Rates Lead to Negative Outcomes

- Reading proficiency of students in Albany's South End is extremely low.
- ONLY 13% of students, grades 3-8, read proficiently in Albany's South End community school, Giffen Memorial Elementary.
- A student who finishes second grade without being able to read has only a 1 in 4 chance of reading at grade level by the end of elementary school.
- Students who are not developing fundamental academic skills are not only at greater risk of dropping out, but are more likely to end up on government assistance, stay unemployed, and struggle with incarceration.
- Often insurmountable challenges will face struggling readers as they become
 adolescents. An inability to read proficiently adds to the symptoms of low academic
 achievement: unsafe behaviors including poor mental health and depression, lower
 self-worth and life satisfaction, increased use of alcohol and other substances, and
 difficulties with peers and family systems.

The Wizard's Wardrobe Invites Students to Read and Learn.

- Our students are young readers living in Albany's South End. They all come to the program reading below grade level.
- Some students are eager to read, some are emerging as readers, and many are struggling. ALL are capable of learning to read. ALL are given the confidence to practice and improve reading skills.
- As 1st and 2nd graders, students can enroll in the Wizard's Wardrobe from whatever school they are attending, as long as they live in the 12202 zip code.
- 90 percent of enrolled 1st and 2nd graders have continued to attend. We encourage them to stay until they graduate from elementary school.
- In 2-1/2 years, our student retention is over 90%.

Why The Wizard's Wardrobe One-to-OneTutoring Program WORKS!

- Research shows that tutoring programs have substantial positive effects on the academic performance and attitudes of students.
- Regular, weekly tutoring sessions generate the most consistent positive gains.
- Gains occur for students who are tutored one-on-one for one hour twice weekly by university students, retirees, and community members.
- Our free program gives parents an equitable opportunity in supporting their child to learn when extra help is needed.
- Our trained tutors are provided best-practice support and guided carefully for each student's needs.
- There is careful monitoring and reinforcement of student progress with pre- and postassessments.
- Regular tutoring sessions are planned, twice a week, with each session 1-1/2 hours to generate the most positive gains.
- Tutoring sessions are well-structured and tutors follow lesson routines.
- There is communication and sharing of information with classroom teachers.
- There is ongoing, monthly supplemental training for tutors.
- Every tutor is guided in learning effective instructional strategies, AND also connect with their student and build a respectful, caring relationship.
- Tutors are trained in cultural competency to heighten their awareness of the strengths and needs of their students.

Student Achievement at the Wizard's Wardrobe

- ALL students progress in reading. They also hone their skills in writing, and problemsolving through STEM activities.
- Two students moved from our program into their school's (GMES) Young Scholar's Program.
- Five students became "published authors," with their writings printed in Scribblers'
 Magazine, and they appeared and read at the 2nd Annual Writers Institute Book
 Festival's Young Writer's Open Mic, on the campus of U-Albany.
- Two students had their story and poem published in the South End's *New Scene*, an on-line and print publication by and about South End community members.

A Day in the Life of A Student Where Reading is Magic!

- Students arrive and step into a castle-like space and are greeted by their tutor.
- They pass through the "wardrobe," into a creatively designed learning space.
- With a healthy snack, they settle down with their tutor and catch up on the day.
- For 1-1/2 hours, student and tutor read, write, explore a STEM activity, engage in a fun learning activity.
- Students and tutors have over 2,100 hundred high-interest, culturally diverse fiction and non-fiction books to choose from.
- Students and tutors learn from each other how to read, think, and share ideas, engage in respectful talk, encourage each other to imagine and dream, strive to be successful in every task.

Who are Our Magical Volunteers?

- Our volunteers tutor because they believe reading is essential to the success of a child in school and in life, and they believe every child has worth.
- Our tutors are committed to building one-to-one relationships, the cornerstone of building confidence that leads to success.
- Our volunteers include a Program Director and Librarian, and 30+ trained tutors.
- Helper volunteers maintain our gift shop and keep our program clean and welcoming.
- Our volunteer community includes senior members of the community, young professionals, college students, and retired teachers and professionals.

Why the Wizard's Wardrobe Leads to Success — Tutors and Students Learning Together

- Our one-to-one tutoring model enables a strong bond between student and tutor, creating a calm, safe, and encouraging environment for learning and for developing non-cognitive skills such as self-control, self-motivation, and confidence that can have positive long-lasting influence in later life.
- Tutors initially participate in a two-day training in cultural competency, social/ emotional learning, the effects of stress and poverty on the developing brain, the fundamentals of early literacy development, and planning a lesson.
- Tutors are offered monthly supplemental training to support their work with students, and individually address a student's learning needs.
- Tutors commit to at least two hours per day, one or two days per week, to ensure they're present for their student.
- Tutors commit to the same student for at least one full year.
- A Program Director is on site during tutor times to support tutors with preparing activities and lessons, and preparing for a student's individual needs.
- Students' spelling, reading skills, and comprehension are assessed by the Program Director at the beginning and end of each academic year.
- Best practice education assessment tools are used. (Words Their Way for spelling; Fountas & Pinnell for reading.)
- Over 2,100 high-interest, culturally diverse fiction and non-fiction books, along with interactive games, puzzles, and instructional materials are integrated into lessons planned with each student's learning style, developmental readiness, and interests in mind

History of The Wizard's Wardrobe

- September 2011: Over 20 members and friends of First Presbyterian Church, in Albany, NY, began tutoring in Giffen Elementary School.
- June 2014: A subset of that group established a one-to-one after-school tutoring program, incorporating one year later as the *South End Neighborhood Tutors*, *Inc.* (S.E.N.T).
- October 2016: a \$50,000 renovation at 20 Rensselaer St. (Steamboat 20) began.
- February 2017: The Wizard's Wardrobe opened its doors to seven (7) students for one-to-one tutoring.
- Sept. 2017 May 2018: Twenty (20) trained tutors provided individualized tutoring to 10 students.
- Sept. 2018 May 19: Twenty-three (23) trained tutors provided individual training to 16 students, and we hired our first part-time Executive Director.
- Sept. 2019-20: Thirty (30) trained tutors provided individualized tutoring to 17 students.

How We Are Funded

- Approximately 75% of our total revenue comes from the donations of our caring, individual supporters, the generosity of our volunteers and Board of Director members.
