Lessons Learned

John Erickson's noon workshop covered a variety of common issues to include

- what to look for when buying an orchid;

- how much water, fertilizer, and sun do orchids need;
- how to recognize and control bugs and other such icky things, etc.

Unique Orchids

Members really enjoyed John Melicio's presentation which included a lot of great hints and info as well as lots of humor.



With thousands of orchids to care for, John says he doesn't have time to babysit them (unlike what many of us do). His orchids are outside -- no greenhouse -- on metal shelving three to four shelves high. His orchids are in full sun -- with the orchids that can take more sun on the top shelf and orchids that take less sun on lower shelves. All his orchids are treated basically the same: watered 2 to 3 times a week and fertilized once a month with 20-20-20. He was quick to point out that everyone has their own style -- and this is his style.

He introduced us to a number of unique orchids from Latin American countries, most of the orchids having wonderful smells. An interesting fact that he shared with us is that in many Latin American countries orchids are the national flowers. He also shared a story about one of his friends in Columbia who has over 600 cattleyas growing around her house in the ground! (Try doing that!!!) Unlike Florida's sandy soil, her soil is volcanic rock which the orchids love.

Hi members!

Here we are, the holiday season is upon us. Where did the year go?

Here's the summary of our finances for the month.

- Our current balance is \$13,366.51.
- We have 60 signed up for the holiday recognition luncheon for a total of \$2,100. Our orchids, which are handed out to each membership attending, will cost the club \$1,300.
- The bus trip income was \$1,435.29 and cost \$1,700 with a net cost to the club \$264.71.
- Our speaker fee was \$150. Raffle income was \$96, and cost of orchids was \$46 for a net of \$50. We also received \$44 in donations to help offset the cost of our luncheon.
- At the Botanical Gardens holiday plant event, we received \$200 for the orchid room, \$100 for our scholarship fund (to be awarded in 2025), and \$75 for the PSLOS general fund.

ALOE & ORCHIDS

After John Erickson's presentation at our November meeting, I was curious to find out more about the connection between aloe and orchids. I watched quite a few YouTube videos from "Happy Garden". Here are some tips from their videos:

Techniques:

- 1. Remove dead, damaged, and diseased leaves and roots from your orchid.
- 2. Wash -- sometimes they used just water and sometimes they used an aloe and water mixture.
- 3. Hang in a cool place for 2 hours.
- 4. There are 2 ways they made aloe juice:
 - a. Cut open the aloe leaf. Remove and save the gel layer for later. Cut the remaining part of the leaf into small pieces and add 500 ml water. Process in a blender. Strain out the residue.

--Put 3 spoonfuls (size of spoon wasn't specified) of rice in 50 ml water. Leave for 2 hours. Strain out and keep the water. Mix rice water with the aloe water.

--Rub the reserved aloe gel over the leaves. Put the orchid in a clear plastic cup. --Soak the plant in the water mixture for 30 minutes.

--<u>Then,</u> get a large, clear plastic tray (with a lid). Put in a layer of styrofoam with a tall stick, a layer of charcoal, the plant, and then secure with sphagnum moss.

Water once a week. Keep covered with lid. In a month, you should see new roots and maybe a new leaf or two.

- b. In another YouTube video, a whole leaf was blended with water. Some of the juice was used to wash the leaves.
- 5. In another YouTube video, leaves were rubbed (quite vigorously, I thought) with aloe leaves that had been sliced open. Two months later, growth was noticed.
- 6. In yet another YouTube video, they posted that the aloe gel contained <u>vitamin B12 and</u> <u>axit folic (folate).</u> When sprayed on flower buds, the buds opened the next day. This got me interested because I have seen some professional growers use axit.

So does it really work? Or is it a myth?

Some growers believe it has the ability to moisturize, heal, and root.

However, an article on Reddit suggests that the evidence is anecdotal, much like tea baths or banana mash. How do you separate the effect of growers giving increased attention to their orchids as a result of whatever they are using as a treatment or regime from the actual thing that they are using? In other words, there were no double blind, very large, multigenera, clonal plant, control factor studies.

As for me, I'm going to try it soon on some keikis....because what do I have to lose?

Tasks for December

December Climate Data

- Average high: 77.5
- Average low: 62.2
- Average mean: 69.9
- Average rainfall: 2.18"

1. Water judiciously - early in the day so plants have as many hours as possible to dry and allow longer intervals between watering to dry plants thoroughly.

2. Reduce fertilizer as most sympodial orchids are resting in December. Provide extra potassium and magnesium. Biweekly or even monthly applications of a balanced fertilizer or 15-5-15 are still desirable.

4. Segregate dormant genera in bright dry area.

5. Keep those vandas, phalaenopsis, and hard cane dendrobiums as warm as you can.
