"Thriving in the Growing Season!

April is here, and with it comes the prime growing season for many orchids! As temperatures rise and days grow longer, it's the perfect time to nurture your orchids toward vigorous growth and stunning blooms. Let's dive into this month's tips and highlights.

#### April Orchid Care Checklist:

• Fertilize for Growth: Orchids are waking up from their winter rest. Use a balanced fertilizer (e.g., 20-20-20) diluted to half strength every 2-3 weeks to support healthy roots, leaves, and spikes.

• **Temperature Adjustments:** Keep an eye on nighttime temperatures. Most orchids prefer nights above 55°F (13°C). If growing outdoors, bring them in during chilly evenings.

• **Pest Patrol:** Warmer weather can bring pests like aphids and spider mites. Inspect leaves and flowers regularly, and treat any infestations with insecticidal soap or neem oil.

#### Spotlight Orchid of the Month:

*Cattleya* (The Queen of Orchids) Known for their fragrant, show-stopping flowers, *Cattleyas* thrive in bright light and welldraining medium. This is a great time to divide and repot mature plants, ensuring robust blooms in the months ahead.

#### Ask the Expert:

Q: My orchid hasn't bloomed in over a yearwhat can I do?

A: Check your light levels. Most orchids need bright, indirect light to bloom. For stubborn plants, try a mild temperature drop at night to trigger flowering.

Our current balance is \$14,490.72.

Our month's income includes: \$2,513 for our show, \$160 for the October bus trip, \$174 for the April picnic, \$204 for cork mounts, a net profit of \$65 for the March orchid raffle and \$879.38 in membership.

## Tasks for April

### April Climate Data

Average high: 83.8 Average low: 67.6 Average mean: 75.7 Average rainfall: 3.36"

- Water heavily when you water; then dry hard.
- Fertilizer becomes more crucially important. Apply:
  - 13-13-13 time release (Dynamite more reliable);
  - 15-15-15 at a rate of 2 tsp per gallon every 2 weeks and fertilizer high in phosphorus once or twice.
- Treat plants for thrips and mites.
- Catch up with all your repotting this month.

# **Mounting Orchids**

Just to review mounting orchids after our hands-on class:

Mounting orchids provides a natural environment for the plant There are several options for mounting orchids:

<u>Tree fern slabs</u> - are pieces of tree trunks, actually compacted dried roots, that can be found in garden centers. They come in a variety of sizes, thicknesses, and densities and may or may not have wire hooks attached to them. They drain water quickly and retain very little moisture. They require more frequent watering than orchids in pots.

<u>Cork slabs</u> - come from the bark of cork trees. Use the outside, or corky side, to mount the orchid. They come in many sizes. Orchid roots attach well to cork. Orchids grown on cork slabs need to be watered frequently. If overwatered, cork can become slimy and moldy. If this happens, cut down on the watering and let the slimy, green stuff dry out and trim it off to reveal fresh cork.

<u>Branches and tree trunks</u> - are a great way to grow orchids. You can use zip ties, pantyhose, or twine to encourage the root to grow onto the tree.

The best time to mount an orchid is after it has flowered and new roots are appearing at the base of the plant.








