## KEIKIS ARE SWEET BABIES

Occasionally an orchid plant will bear a little plantlet off of its flower stem or pseudo-bulbs. These little plants are often called <u>keiki</u> ( Hawaiian for "baby"). Keikis happen more frequently on Phalaenopses, Epidendrums, and Dendrobiums than on other orchids. Keikis are genetically identical to their parent and will bear flowers that look like the parent.

Some orchids produce such babies naturally and are fairly easy to grow. Plant hormones can be applied to a node on the bloom spike or base to stimulate the growth of a keiki.

Once the keiki has roots of one to three inches it can be repotted. Some growers recommend putting it in the same pot as the parent because the parent will help regulate moisture levels during a crucial time. When repotting, encourage the roots to go downward. You can use a bit of the flower spike or pseudobulb to help anchor it.

You can choose to leave the baby on the parent plant and both may flower simultaneously.

A <u>basal keiki</u> develops at the base of the plant. It is left on the plant and usually grows quickly.

It is generally acceptable to provide extra nitrogen for support of green growth.

Conditions conducive to speedy and healthy keiki growth and development include maintaining temperatures, using clonal paste on only a few nodes, maintaining humidity and using a fertilizer with an NPK of 30-10-10 or 6-1-1.



November Climate Data


Average high: 85.4 Average low: 72.2 Average mean: 78.8 Average rainfall: 6.19"

- 1. Prepare for cold
- 2. Reduce fertilizer 3. Apply extra Potassium and Magnesium
- 4. Segregate dormant genera in bright dry area
  5. Repot plants after flowering
  6. Groom plants and flower spikes for holiday display
