"Preparing Orchids for New Growth"

March marks the arrival of spring, a critical time for orchid enthusiasts to gear up for the active growing season. Warmer temperatures and longer days mean it's time to shift your orchid care routine. This month, I'll focus on maximizing growth and bloom potential as your orchids awaken from winter dormancy.

Reviving Orchids After Winter:

With increased sunlight, adjust your orchids' placement to provide bright, indirect light without scorching leaves. Gradually increase watering frequency as temperatures rise, ensuring the potting media dries slightly between waterings.

Spring Cleaning

Now is the perfect time to clean up your collection. Inspect leaves for pests like scale or spider mites, trim dead roots, and remove any old, decayed pseudobulbs. Consider repotting orchids that have outgrown their pots or have degrading media.

Spotlight Orchid: Oncidium Orchids

Nicknamed "Dancing Ladies," Oncidiums are spring favorites. Known for their abundant sprays of blooms, these orchids thrive with increased light and regular fertilizing during the growing season. Be sure to keep their roots aerated and avoid soggy media.

Seasonal Tips:

• Start feeding orchids with a balanced fertilizer (20-20-20) at half strength every two weeks.

• Increase humidity levels indoors if necessary.

• Plan ahead for local orchid shows or plant sales this season—Our April 5-6 Orchid Show is the perfect time to expand your collection!

Keep your arrangements within the dimensions of the niche:

Mini--6" wide, 4" deep, 8" tall Small - 8" wide, 6" deep, 12" tall Large - 10" wide, 8" deep, 18" tall

Your container should be plain so as not to distract from the flowers, and only natural foliage can be used.


FEBRUARY 17TH PSLOS MEETING

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS

Our current balance is \$13,603.58.

Our January/February income includes \$1,825 from show vendors, \$1,940 in show sponsors, \$835 t-shirt sales, \$98 for our April picnic, \$50 newsletter advertising, \$84 in cork mounts for our March mounting class, and \$166 at the January Botanical Gardens event.

Our expenses include \$123 for our monthly storage, \$250 for cork mounts for our March class, \$250 speaker fee, \$137 for meeting supplies, \$269 for membership brochures, \$134 for miscellaneous show items, \$100 for orchid room supplies, and \$16.33 to rent the pavilion for our April picnic.

Tasks for March

•Average high: 80.7

•Average low: 64

- •Average mean: 72.4
- •Average rainfall: 2.56"



- Repot cattleyas and other sympodials that finished blooming over the winter if you haven't already done so and the hard cane dendrobiums that need it (remember they don't like to be disturbed and like their roots crowded).
- Replant genera which are breaking out of dormancy (e.g., catasetums, mormodes, etc.)
- Apply slow release fertilizer to last the season (Dynamite is the best) and regular 15-5-15 fertilizer weekly thereafter.
- Slowly acclimatize sun-loving plants that have been in the shade to full sun.
- 'Tis the season for THRIPS! Orthene is the chemical of choice. Liquid dish soap (2 oz per gallon of water) is a non-chemical solution and should be applied thoroughly (water your plants the day before applying soap).

Hybridizing Orchids

<u>Species</u> - a naturally occurring interbreeding group within a genus

<u>Hybrid</u> - the offspring produced when 2 or more different species, or hybrids, are cross pollinated

So what are hybridizers looking to achieve when they make a cross? These are some of the things that I found: (Not prioritized)

- 1. The acquisition of worthy breeding plants and an understanding of how to unlock their potential in hybrids
- 2. Important dominant traits
- 3. To improve the form- such as creating wider petals, ruffled lips or petals, fuller lips
- 4. To intensify color, such as making darker lips, or to get sunset colors
- 5. To improve flower size
- 6. To reduce the plant to miniature stature while keeping its best qualities, such as intense color
- 7. To get a velvety texture
- 8. To get flares
- 9. To reduce plant size and flatten flower form
- 10. To get higher counts of shapely flowers
- 11. To get well supported flowers, sturdy stems
- 12. To get contrasting lips
- 13. To get larger flowers on smaller plants
- 14. To get plants that bloom multiple times during the year
