This month's Orchid-abulary is dedicated to words associated with various orchid pests and diseases.

**Pest** — any organism that can cause disease or injury to plants.

Mealybugs— serious orchid pests that look like tiny white cotton balls that cause a loss of vigor and weakening, loss of leaves, buds and flowers; their "honeydew" attracts ants and is a substrate for sooty mold; they hide on roots and rhizomes deep in medium, on pseudobulbs, and undersides of leaves; spread fast



**Blight** — the rapid decline and death of plant parts; this term is often used with the name of a pathogen (example- Botrytis blight) or plant part affected (example- blossom blight)





Color break- a viral disease symptom to describe the discoloration of flowers as evidenced by a change in intensity of color and/or pattern. Color break may also result from a genetic mutation.





**Crown rot** — disease caused by a soil-borne fungus which can survive in soil indefinitely; favors wet conditions; identified by droopy leaves breaking off at the base of the stem, sometimes the entire orchid will turn black; you may be able to save the orchid by treating with hydrogen peroxide



**Leaf spot**- an obvious area of tissue on a leaf caused by various types of pathogens





**Broad spectrum pesticide**- refers to a chemical agent that controls a wide range of pests Check out the AOS library on diseases and pests: https://www.aos.org/orchids/orchid-pests-diseases.aspx

## Tasks for April

April Climate Data Average high: 83.8 Average low: 67.6 Average mean: 75.7 Average rainfall: 3.36"

- Water heavily when you water; then dry hard.
- Fertilizer becomes more crucially important. Apply:
  - 13-13-13 time release (Dynamite more reliable);
  - 15-15-15 at a rate of 2 tsp per gallon every 2 weeks; and
  - fertilizer high in phosphorus once or twice.
- Treat plants for thrips and mites.
- Catch up with all your repotting this month.







