<u> Tasks for March</u>

- •Average high: 80.7
- •Average low: 64
- •Average mean: 72.4
- •Average rainfall: 2.56"
- Repot cattleyas and other sympodials that finished blooming over the winter if you haven't already done so and the hard cane dendrobiums that need it (remember they don't like to be disturbed and like their roots crowded).
- Replant those genera which are breaking out of dormancy (e.g., catasetums, mormodes, etc.)
- Apply slow release fertilizer to last the season (Dynamite is the best.) and regular 15-5-15 fertilizer weekly thereafter.
- Slowly acclimatize sun-loving plants that have been in the shade to full sun.
- 'Tis the season for THRIPS! Orthene is the chemical of choice. Liquid dish soap (2 oz per gallon of water) is a non-chemical solution and should be applied thoroughly (water your plants the day before applying soap).

Orchid-abulary

Brought to you by Nan Rothschild 2nd Vice President Dendrobiums An extremely large and varied genus containing both deciduous and evergreen types. Hybrids come in a rainbow of colors.

Dendrobium bigibbum - consists of a wide variety of hybrids; used for cut flower trade

Dendrobium kingianum and hybrids - compact, prolific, easy to grow

Dendro contras with m fragrar

Dendrobium nobile hybrids - spectacularly colored, contrast-throated, bamboo-like canes; usually sold with many arranged on short stems; noted for fragrance

NOID - means no ID; the plant is unidentifiable

Dendrobium phaleanopsis - flowers grow on long stems and look similar to phaleanopsis flowers; a favorite of the cut flower trade, especially in Hawaii; flowers are hardy and long lasting

Cane - an elongated pseudobulb


Deciduous - a plant that sheds its leaves annually

Member Michael Ortseifer also uses this technique.


