The Port St. Lucie Botanical Gardens (PSLBG) formally opened on March 6, 2010. The original Gardens design plans included only two gardens: the Orchid Room and the Bromeliad Garden. The Port St. Lucie Orchid Society (PSLOS) started the Orchid Room with two volunteers attaching donated orchids to the trees. Routine maintenance included hand watering on an as needed basis and fertilizing weekly.

Fast forward to today, our Orchid Room committee has seven members, five of whom meet each Tuesday on a rotating basis and spend 2-3 hours maintaining the Orchid Room. Tasks include hand watering and fertilizing 350+ orchids, potting new orchids, and repot-ting existing orchids. The result has been the development of a first-rate garden that visitors enjoy and appreciate.

The PSLBG has developed proposed new signage that reads: "The Orchid Room has be-come one of our visitors' favorite garden rooms. As you walk through this garden, you will see that there are many creative ways that you can display orchids from an orchid in a hanging basket to one tied to a tree or a piece of driftwood, or even a living wall of orchids.'

The PSLBG and the PSLOS have established a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that allows the PSLOS to hold meetings at the 2025.




### TERMS ASSOCIATED WITH FERTILIZING

Fertilizing - means systematically feeding your orchids

How often? The general advice is "weakly, weekly."

•





Many growers prefer a <u>balanced fertilizer</u>, for example an N-P-K of 10-10-10.

<u>Trace elements</u> - There are about 17 micronutrients plants need in very small amounts. These include: calcium, magnesium, boron, chlorine, cobalt, copper, iron, manganese, molybdenum, sodium and zinc.



What do the numbers on a fertilizer mean? (N-P-K):

- The first number indicates the <u>nitrogen content</u>. A high nitrogen food (example, 12-10-10) is used to promote growth at the start of the growing season.
- The second number indicates the <u>phosphorus con-</u> <u>tent</u>. A higher "P" number fertilizer encourages flowering, often referred to as a <u>bloom booster</u>. ( Example- 0-10-10)
- The third number indicates the <u>potassium content</u> which promotes all around wellbeing.

#### Sample label on Peters Professional Bloom Booster (with trace elements):

**Peters Professional Bloom Booster 10-30-20 1 Lb.** Professional grade bloom booster. 1-3-2 ratio of N-P-K. Supports healthy growth & vigorous blooms. No Urea.

<u>Slow release fertilizer</u>, or <u>granular fertilizer</u>, is sprinkled on the base of the plant; the nutrients are released slowly over time when the plant is watered.



#### Signs of overfertilizing

 A white residue (excess fertilizer from and salts) on the leaves; flush with water and don't fertilize for a month.
 Normally green root tips are browned and dead-looking.

### Tasks for December

#### **December Climate Data**

- Average high: 77.5
- Average low: 62.2
- Average mean: 69.9
- Average rainfall: 2.18"

1. Water judiciously - early in the day so plants have as many hours as possible to dry and allow longer intervals between watering to dry plants thoroughly.

2. Reduce fertilizer as most sympodial orchids are resting in December. Provide extra potassium and magnesium. Biweekly or even monthly applications of a balanced fertilizer or 15-5-15 are still desirable.

4. Segregate dormant genera in bright dry area.

5. Keep those vandas, phalaenopsis, and hard cane dendrobiums as warm as you can.


