

I hope this letter finds you well and avoiding the heat as much as possible. As we move into September, it's a great time to start thinking about dividing your orchids. Dividing orchids can help them grow stronger and healthier and give you the opportunity to share your orchids with friends and family.

The Orchid Room Committee (Dana De-Marco, Andrea Heitfield, Lynn Fort, Anne Mygatt, Dianne Jenkins, Mary Nodelman, and myself) have already done this with an Oncidium which had overgrown the edges of a horizontal branch. We've gotten several nice-size divisions that we've added to our 4"x4"x8' Oncidium pole. We meet every Tuesday and have started a concerted effort to fertilize "weekly/weakly" with a mixture of Carbon fertilizer, Orthene insecticide and Physan 20 fungicide/bactericide. See for yourself the results.

Andrea Heitfelt, Dana DeMarco, and I also recently gave a "Repotting Orchids Workshop" to a new Garden Club in Kings Isle Saint Lucie West. Their President, Joyce Rossetti, told me that at their last meeting they had six people attend; 39 attended the workshop. Many attendee's expressed their appreciation and interest in growing orchids. I took the opportunity to invite them to our next meeting on September 18 at the Port St Lucie Botanical Gardens (PSLBG). It was also recommended that the Garden Club take a field trip to the PSLBG and visit the Orchid Room.

We hope to see you all at our September meeting.

Great to see such a huge turnout on such a hot day! At least we had that nice breeze from the water.











## Orchid-abulary Brought to you by Nan Rothschild 2nd Vice President

OH, THOSE BEAUTIFUL COLORS!

Sometimes we see unusually vivid colors of orchids in the supermarket. These may have been artificially dyed and have names that may include, for example, "Mystique" or "Watercolor."



### How do they get their color?

Most dyed orchids have pigment (usually food grade dye) injected into their stems although there are other possible methods. The concentrations and colors vary. The hole that has been created is sometimes sealed with wax. The stem takes the dye up through its vascular system, and the bloom starts to change color within 24 hours.

When the dyed orchid reblooms, the new bloom will be the color of the original plant. Most frequently, white Phaleanopsis orchids are used because the white blooms will take up the ink most readily. Naturally purplish bloomers are used for an indigo color, and yellow bloomers are used for a pink lemonade color.

#### How can you tell if an orchid is dyed?

Sometimes by sight alone - comparing a natural color to a dyed one. Sometimes you can see the dye on the roots or potting medium. You can also look at the flower spike for an injury where the dye was injected. In addition, younger flowers on the spike are often lighter than the more mature blooms that opened first.

### Tasks for September

Fall Climate Data
Average high: 89.0
Average low: 75.7
Average mean: 82.4
Average rainfall: 8.38"



- Careful watering this month often means no watering at all. Water only when truly necessary.
- Space plants amply. Good air circulation is essential across the coming months.
- Re-pot Phals and reset Vandas. Make sure that plants are firmly set in their new abodes.
- Begin or continue a disease prevention program.
- Clean up growing area and plants. Remove dead leaves from plants and the ground. Prune trees and shrubs to increase light and air circulation.
- Apply snail bait lightly early in the month and again lightly mid-month.








