Treasurer's Report

Our current balance is \$7894.47. Our expenditures include \$460 for a large tent for our orchid show, \$60 for raffle orchids, \$127 reimbursed to Nan for a vanilla making class at our show, \$32 reimbursed to Andrea for show supplies, and \$1,704 for 13 month rental of a storage unit. Income includes \$500 show fee, \$30 trophy sponsorship and \$40 for memberships. We took in \$132 at the raffle table and \$455 in memberships which will be deposited September 27. Looking forward to seeing everyone in October!

#### PSLOS ANNUAL ORCHID AUCTION November 9, 2021

The Port Saint Lucie Orchid Annual Orchid Auction RETURNS! The purpose of the auction is to provide members with an outlet to dispose of plants from their own collections, to provide the orchid loving public with an opportunity to purchase quality plants at fair prices, and to further our mission to add to the ranks of orchid addicts.

The rules are as follows:

1. Only society members may offer plants for sale, but ALL buyers are welcome.

2. Usually we limit members to 20 plants for sale....due to missing a year because of COVID-19, we are allowing members to sell more (within reason, please). For every 10 plants that you bring to sell, one is donated to the Society's table.

3. The auction is designed to help members manage their collections. It is not meant to be an outlet for commercial or quasi-commercial sales.

4. 10% of all sales will go to the society. Checks to sellers will be provided within 30 days of the auction.

5. If a seller's plants are not all auctioned off, further sales may be conducted independent of the auction AFTER all sales have been tallied and may not occur within the auction building. (Or you can choose to donate them to the garden's orchid room.)

6. Each plant will be auctioned individually. The auctioneer will not sell one plant and then several more of the same plant for the same price without bidding.

7. Plants for sale must be brought to the auction no later than 30 minutes prior to the auction. There is paperwork for the seller to fill out on each plant. If there is a minimum bid, a label must be put on a leaf (labels will be provided at sign-in). Plants brought after that time will not be considered.

8. Plants will be auctioned at random. We alternate between sellers.

9. ALL SALES ARE FINAL. We take cash, check, or charge.

# Orchid-abulary

Brought to you by Nan Rothschild 2nd Vice President Fall brings with it a host of orchid problems. Here are some of the problems that we hear about frequently.

<u>Crown rot</u> - disease type where the pathogen infects the host plant at the soil or medium level, girdling and killing the plant





<u>**Ringspot</u></u> - viral disease symptom that exhibits chlorotic or necrotic ring patterns, with green centers, on plant tissue</u>** 

<u>Sooty mold</u> - darkly pigmented fungi that feed on honeydew secreted by such insects as aphids, mealybugs, scales and whiteflies and thereby produce a sooty covering on leaves, stems and fruit





<u>Leaf spot</u> - an obvious area of diseased tissue on a leaf, variable in size, shape and color, that may be caused by various pathogens

<u>**Resupination</u></u> - 180 degree twisting of a flower stalk as it develops bringing what would be the bottom of the flower to the top and vice versa</u>**

# Tasks for October



- Space plants to increase air circulation.
- Water as early as possible in the day.
- Catasetums, mormodes, Cycnoches, calanthes and other deciduous types should be treated the same way at this time of year. Remove to an area where they will receive little if any watering.
- Harden off cattleyas, laelias, oncidiums and phalaenopsis-type dendrobiums with less frequent watering.
- Reduce general fertilizer.
