Noon Class: Repotting Cattleyas







Are your garden gnomes feeling left out? Do they want to be in the show?



Tasks for September

Fall Climate Data
Average high: 89.0
Average low: 75.7
Average mean: 82.4
Average rainfall: 8.38"



- Careful watering this month often means no watering at all. Water only when truly necessary.
- Space plants amply. Good air circulation is essential across the coming months.
- Re-pot Phals and reset Vandas. Make sure that plants are firmly set in their new abodes.
- Begin or continue a disease prevention program.
- Clean up growing area and plants. Remove dead leaves from plants and the ground. Prune trees and shrubs to increase light and air circulation.
- Apply snail bait lightly early in the month and again lightly mid-month.

Orchid-abulary

Brought to you by Nan Rothschild 2nd Vice President Summer brings with it a host of orchid problems. Here are some of the problems that we hear about frequently.

<u>Scale</u> - sucking insects that attach to the underside of leaves, in leaf axils, on pseudobulbs, and on rhizomes. They're often hidden under old leaves and pseudobulb sheaths. Severe infestations cause chlorotic areas to appear on the leaves and plant surfaces, which will yellow and may darken and cause leaves to drop prematurely.



White boisduval scale - bane of cattleman growers; mature males form cottony white masses while mature females lay their eggs under whitish circular shields.

<u>Hard scale</u> - an armored scale that forms a brown conical structure.





<u>Chlorosis</u> - leaves produce insufficient chlorophyll and become yellow or whitened. (Photo reprinted from https://staugorchidsociety.org/PDF/ LeafSpottingFungi-Part1-NewAnthracnosebySueBottom.pdf)

<u>Mealy bugs</u> - sucking insects that can attack any part of plant, but tend to be at the junction of leaf and stem. Causes chlorotic areas and premature leaf drop.





<u>Thrips</u> - very small sucking insects that feed on flowers and occasionally leaves. Can transmit disease. Infested buds may not open and flowers can be deformed, exhibiting water soak spots. Leaves may appear pitted, stipples, silvery, or bleached.

<u>Spider mites</u> - are not insects but part of the arachnid (spider) family. They feed on the underside of leaves. Leaves may get webbing or brown splotches.
