On July 20<sup>th</sup>, Dana DeMarco, Laurie Wade and myself sold orchids, mounts and fertilizer at the "Taste of the Tropics Show." We sold out and cleared \$144.69.

In October 2023, I started a segment entitled "Exploring Orchids". I would like to continue with information on Dendrobiums:

Removing leafless canes on a Dendrobium orchid can be beneficial under certain conditions. If the cane is completely dead, shriveled, or shows signs of disease or pest infestation, it's best to remove it to prevent these issues from spreading to healthy parts of the plant. Dead or dying canes can also attract fungal or bacterial infections, so removing them promptly can help maintain the overall health of the orchid.

However, if the cane is simply leafless but otherwise healthy and shows no signs of new growth at its nodes, it may be worth keeping. Dendrobiums orchids can naturally shed leaves from older canes as part of their growth cycle, especially after flowering. These canes can still contribute to the plant's energy storage and blooming potential.

Before removing any canes, assess their condition carefully. If in doubt, you can wait until new growth emerges to confirm the health of the cane. Regular orchid care practices, such as providing proper light, humidity, and watering, can also help rejuvenate leafless canes and encourage new growth.

## **PSLOS ANNUAL ORCHID AUCTION**

(No Noon Class)

The Port Saint Lucie Orchid Society's Annual Orchid Auction RETURNS! The purpose of the auction is to provide members with an outlet to dispose of plants from their own collections, to provide the orchid loving public with an opportunity to purchase quality plants at fair prices, and to further our mission to add to the ranks of orchid addicts.

11:00 a.m. - Doors will open for members who are bringing orchids to be auctioned. No plants will be accepted for sale after 12:30 p.m. SELLERS, PLEASE BE PROMPT!

12:30 p.m. – Doors will open for buyer viewing of the orchids being auctioned.

1:00 p.m. — The auction will begin and goes until finished. There are no planned breaks.

BUYERS: THERE IS NO EARLY CHECKOUT. YOU NEED TO BE ABLE TO STAY UNTIL THE END AS IT IS TOO DISRUPTIVE IF WE ALLOW EARLY CHECKOUTS. THANK YOU FOR YOUR UNDERSTANDING.

The rules are as follows:

1. Only society members may offer plants for sale, but ALL buyers are welcome.

2. Members are limited to 20 plants for sale. For every 10 plants that you bring to sell, one is donated to the Society's table.

3. The auction is designed to help members manage their collections. It is not meant to be an outlet for commercial or quasi-commercial sales.

4. Plants for sale must be brought to the auction no later than 30 minutes prior to the auction. There is paperwork for the seller to fill out on each plant. If there is a minimum bid, a label must be put on a leaf (labels will be provided at sign-in). Plants brought after that time will not be considered.

5. 10% of all sales will go to the society. Checks to sellers will be provided within 30 days of the auction.

6. Plants will be auctioned at random. We alternate between sellers.

7. Each plant will be auctioned individually. The auctioneer will not sell one plant and then several more of the same plant for the same price without bidding.

8. If a seller's plants are not all auctioned off, further sales may be conducted independent of the auction AFTER all sales have been tallied and may not occur within the auction build-ing. (Or you can choose to donate them to the garden's orchid room.)

9. ONLY THE AUCTIONEER and/or assistant (not bidders) will determine the last bid by saying "sold."

10. ALL SALES ARE FINAL. We take cash, check, or charge. THERE IS NO EARLY CHECKOUT.

#### Tasks for September

<u>Fall Climate Data</u> Average high: 89.0 Average low: 75.7 Average mean: 82.4 Average rainfall: 8.38"



- Careful watering this month often means no watering at all. Water only when truly necessary.
- Space plants amply. Good air circulation is essential across the coming months.
- Re-pot Phals and reset Vandas. Make sure that plants are firmly set in their new abodes.
- Begin or continue a disease prevention program.
- Clean up growing area and plants. Remove dead leaves from plants and the ground. Prune trees and shrubs to increase light and air circulation.
- Apply snail bait lightly early in the month and again lightly mid-month.

#### **AERIAL ROOTS**

Aerial roots absorb hydration from water droplets and nutritious micro-elements traveling on wind currents. Aerial roots also aid in photosynthesis since most orchids don't grow in soil. Never cut aerial roots since this will hinder the amount of nutrients and water absorption the orchid receives. The velamen (white ,absorbent layer that covers roots) capture sunlight and transform it into energy. Keep the aerial roots above ground.

As the rainforest is poor in nutrients, most orchids don't grow in the soil. Seeds attach themselves to trees, 1/3 of the height of the tree, where they are in the air. They get indirect sunlight there also.

The end of aerial roots will be smooth and pointed or slightly round tipped. A silvery white color will predominate and turn green when watered. A flower spike, on the other hand, will be bumpy at the end, with sharp ends, and a few tiny nodules. It doesn't turn color when wet since it is already greener than aerial roots. Vandas have prominent aerial roots.

Aerial roots need to be potted or mounted. If potted, roots prefer to be placed tightly in a pot, rather than having excess room to grow. It gives the orchid stability and security. Aerial roots make the orchid safe and secure, allowing it to send out a flower spike.

Aerial roots tend to dry out faster than roots that are buried in the pot. Spray or mist often or cover with a very thin layer of wet sphagnum moss. Aerial roots aren't as malleable as roots sitting in contact with wet medium but can be made slightly more pliable when soaked in lukewarm, not hot, water. They can then be repotted to fit under the new medium...but don't be surprised that most will die off.
