#### **Dendrobium**

- 2nd largest genus in orchids 1400 species (Bulbophyllum – 1<sup>st</sup>)
- Hard Cane and Soft Cane
- Grows from Sea Level to 12,000 ft.
- Six to eight main sections
   (some say five only, some say more)
- From Greek meaning "Life on a Tree"
- Grow naturally in China, Japan, Malaysia, India, Phillipines, New Zealand, Austrailia & but majority are from Papua New Guinea.





#### 1. Phalaenanthe Section

- Most Common
- Easy to Grow, however 55-60° F min. temps
- Known as hard cane dendrobiums. Along with Spatulata Section
- Temps from 50° 90° F Humidity 50-60%
- Evergreen
- Have eyes at base of cane & like loose mix (Similar to Cattleya)
- Propagates with Spatulata Section





Likes cool weather in winter but not below 45° F and dry. No fertilizer

# 4. Dendrobium Section(Group 1)

Spring and Summer - Lots of water & fertilizer when growing. In Winter – more light.

No water or fertilizer and nights can go down to 40° F

Lots of water & fertilizer when growing. But should not go below 55° F & no water in Winter.

## 5. Formosae Section

Intermediate to warm min. 40° F max 95° F Bright indirect light. Drier in Winter

High light levels. Warm to cool High humidity. Slight rest in winter.

# 7. Dendrocoryne Section

Heavy fertilizer & water in Summer, less in Winter. Temps down to 30° F, and blooms better with Winter chill.

Heavy water & fertilizer in Summer, cooler and dryer and less water & fertilizer in Winter.

#### **Culture**

#### **REPOTTING**

- Use chunky bark like Orchiata
- Do not disturb roots except for old hollow decayed roots. It's ok to leave some old mix.
- Use a pot "just" big enough and pack in mix very tightly.

  Make sure plant doesn't move and new eyes rest on top of mix.
- Use clay if possible. Dendrobiums are top heavy. Can use rocks in bottom of pot. Also hanging pot avoids tipping over.
- For gigantic dens. You will have to be creative milk crates, waste baskets, etc.
- Can be attached to trees.
- Keikis can be repotted
- Don't use copper or copper-based fungicides.
