President's Message

John Erickson Your President

Start the Year Right with Thriving Orchids!

January is a time of renewal, making it the perfect month to give your orchids some extra attention. Whether it's repotting, encouraging stubborn plants to bloom, or preparing for the upcoming growing season, a little effort now will pay off all year.

Repotting Basics:

As orchids slow down after blooming, it's a great time to check if they need repotting. Look for signs like crowded roots, breaking-down potting medium, or poor drainage. Repot into fresh orchid bark or sphagnum moss, and choose a clear pot with drainage holes for easy monitoring. Remember to handle roots gently and only trim those that are dead or mushy.

Encouraging Dormant Orchids to Bloom:

If your orchid isn't producing flower spikes, cooler nighttime temperatures (around 60°F) can trigger blooming. Feed regularly with a balanced orchid fertilizer, switching to a bloom booster high in phosphorus (e.g., 10-30-20) during this phase. Be patient—flower spikes take weeks to develop but are worth the wait!

<u>Spotlight Orchid: Paphiopedilum (Lady Slipper Orchids)</u>

These charming orchids are ideal for January! With their pouch-like blooms and easy care, they thrive in lower light and prefer consistently moist—but not soggy—roots.

Quick Tip:

Keep an eye on indoor humidity, especially during the dry winter months. A humidity tray or humidifier can help prevent leaf wrinkling and bud drop. Start the year strong by nurturing your orchids. A little care now will ensure they reward you with vibrant blooms in the months ahead!







TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS

Greetings to everyone!

Here's the December summary of our bank account.

Our current balance is \$11,733.55. The check I wrote to Florida Orchid House is still outstanding so once that is cashed our balance will be \$10,373.55.

We collected \$2,373.70 which includes the auction of orchids at the end of our holiday luncheon and sales tax paid to the state on those sales. We paid \$3,105.96 to Gator Trace, Florida Orchid House, and for prizes awarded during our games.

We collected \$124.38 in dues (one membership was by credit card, the fee we pay to Square makes this an odd amount). We paid \$104 for storage, \$23 to GoDaddy for our domain name renewal, \$48 in greenery and moss for the Fort Pierce show display, and \$91 for orchids for our Orchid Room.

ORCHID CULTURE & CARE

Orchid-abulary

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

If you have ever been confused by a tag on your orchid, hopefully this will help. In most cases, if you want an orchid to be judged, it will require a tag. Some societies will accept a NOID (no identification tag).

All orchids belong to the family **orchidacea** (pronounced or-kid-DAY-see-eye). You will seldom see the family name on a tag. Orchids are then grouped into various subfamilies, tribes, and subtribes. Again, we don't worry about that on our tags.

Within the family are many **genera** (pronounced JEN-er-ah). Genus names come first (ex. Cattleya, Phaleanopsis). The genus name may be abbreviated.

Next comes the **Species** name (SPE-sees). The word is both singular and plural. It can be found in the wild and wasn't created by a human. Even if it has since been propagated, it won't be capitalized.

Hybrids may be made by nature, but most are man-made. A hybrid name looks just the same as a species name. The name must be registered with the Royal Horticultural Society. The species name begins with a small letter, the genus and hybrid names with capitals.

The name of a hybrid is called a collective epithet. It applies to every seedling from the cross and all future seedlings of that cross. Orchids of one genus can hybridize with orchids of another genus creating a bigeneric hybrid (not all plants or animals can do this). There are also multigeneric plants with several genera in their background. They are often a show winner among orchids and produce fascinating flowers. Hybrid names are capitalized and called a **grex** - the hybrid parents are given in *Roman type* without quotation marks. Since the seed may produce many plants, the owner may give individual plants names to distinguish select cultivars of unusual merit.

Average rainfall: 1.88




- Be prepared to protect outdoor plants from freezing temperatures.
- Spray for mites; spray again in 7-10 days.
- Many genera are entering or are in flowering season. Stake for better displays.
- Flush excess fertilizer salts from Cattleyas and other sympodials.
- Watering, fertilizing, and re-potting should be kept to a minimum.
- Water early in the day.


