President's Message John Erickson

As part of our Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Port St. Lucie Botanical Gardens, the PSLOS maintains over 350 orchids in the Orchid Room.

Many of these orchids are potted in an organic medium of fir bark or sphagnum moss which require frequent maintenance as they need replenishing periodically as they break down over time.

Because of that, we have gone to an inorganic medium consisting of 40% Royal Oak 100% hardwood lump charcoal which has to be broken down into smaller chips, 30% rubber nuggets, 10% perlite, 10% clay pellets, and 10% lava rock. Note: The dust on the lava rock and charcoal chips needs to be rinsed off before being used.

This inorganic medium provides excellent aeration and drainage, preventing root rot by allowing excess water to flow away. Inorganic mediums also resist decomposition, reducing the frequency of repotting and allowing for better control over moisture levels. Additionally, inorganic mediums discourage pests and fungal growth, promoting healthier root systems. However, they may require more frequent watering, and they lack nutrients, necessitating regular fertilization to sustain plant growth.

Choosing the right inorganic medium and mastering its usage can involve a learning curve for novice orchid enthusiasts.

November quote: "An Orchid in a deep forest sends out its fragrance even if no one is around to appreciate it."



- how to recognize and control bugs and other such icky things, etc.








1:00 Presentation: Unique Orchids



- 4. Segregate dormant genera in bright dry area5. Repot plants after flowering

AQUACULTURE FOR ORCHIDS

Aquaculture consists of having the orchid in a vase with absolutely no orchid medium like moss or bark. The only medium will be water and air.

Steps:

- 1. Choose the most appropriate time for the plant. It should be in a period of dormancy.
- 2. Clean all old medium off the roots. If you just bought the plant, transfer it as soon as the blooms fall off. If it was potted in sphagnum moss, it is especially important to get rid of the moss as it can accumulate mold and bacteria and cause root rot.
- 3. Cut off all dead and rotting roots. (Can treat ends with cinnamon.)
- 4. Choose the method:

<u>Aquaculture</u> - orchid will sit in a little water for 5 days and then no water for 2 days. Clean the vase often due to a buildup of mold and bacteria.

<u>Semi aquaculture</u> - fill water 3/4 way roots- almost to the top. Soak for 2 days, dry for 5.

Some expectations:

- 1. Old roots will die off since they haven't adapted yet to aquaculture.
- 2. New roots will grow into the water.
- 3. Some leaves may die off because they haven't adapted to aquaculture.
- 4. New roots should be given a weak solution of fertilizer weekly.
- 5. There is always a risk of the plant dying. This method is best tried first on a less valuable or treasured plant.
