Bush and a proclamation from the City of Abilene declaring September 7 & 8 as White House Communications Days in Abilene. Marlin Fitzwater graduated from Abilene High School and grew up near Abilene.

The wreath laying ceremony was held in the Place of Meditation with Mary Jean Eisenhower participating in the wreath laying ceremony. The ceremony began with playing Hail to the Chief and was concluded with taps immediately following the wreath placement.

The public meeting for the community was held at 7:00 p. s. at the Abilene with Mike Ebbing, Chief Switchboard Operator at Camp David from 1970-1972 and Harland Priddle, Deputy Commander of WHCA from 1970-1974. Their narration and slide presentations covered memories and experiences during their time with WHCA. There was a packed house with every seat filled
