IN 1856 CHARLES SUMNER OF MASSACHUSETTS WOULD GIVE ONE OF THE MOST CONTROVERSIAL SPEECHES IN THE SENATE'S HISTORY, TITLED "THE CRIME AGAINST KANSAS."

MAN MARRYING AN UGLY HARLOT.



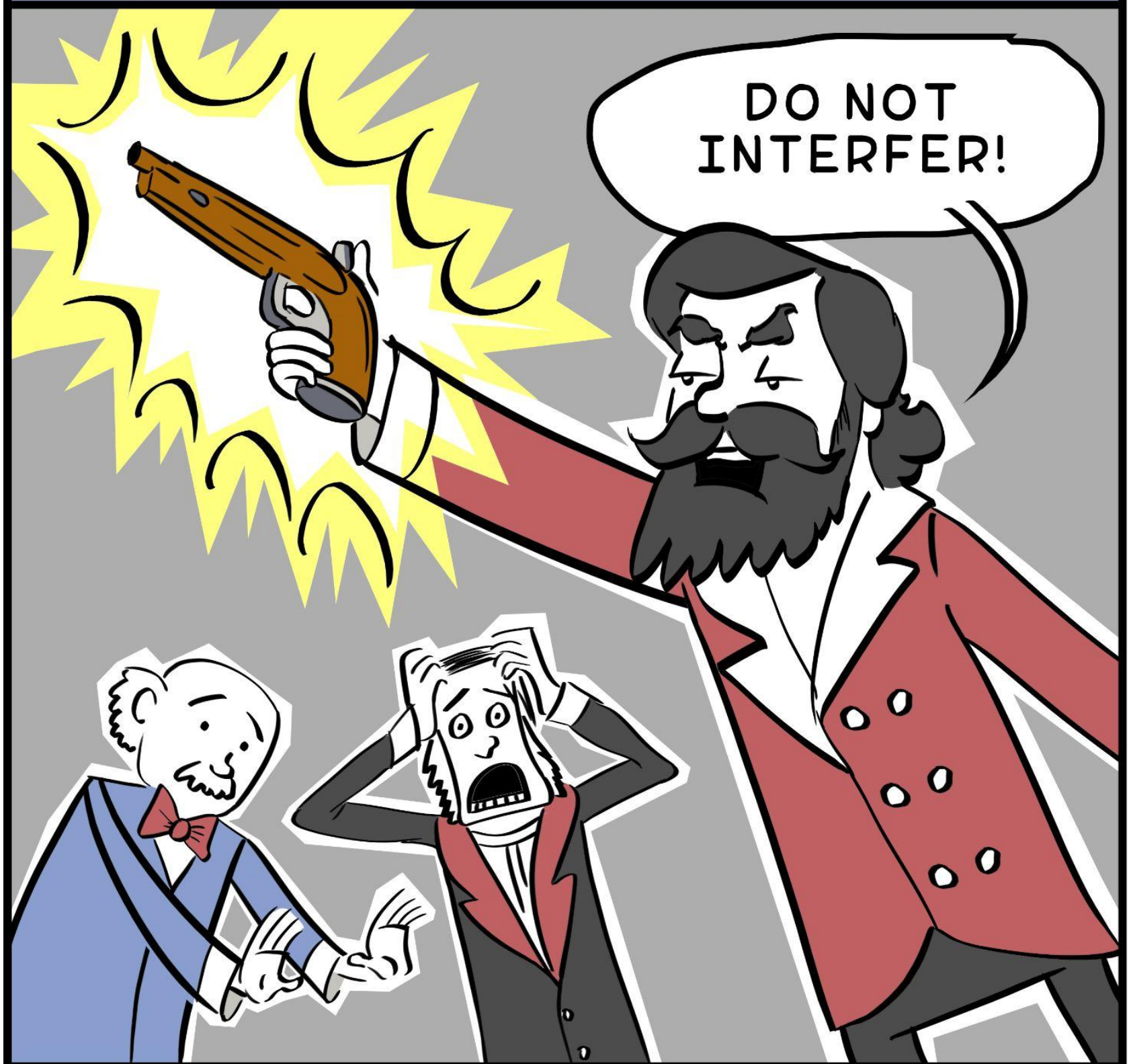
WHEN SUMNER INSULTED BUTLER IT ENRAGED BUTLER'S COUSIN NAMED PRESTON BROOKS. WHO WAS A REPRESENTATIVE OF SOUTH CAROLINA.



DAYS AFTER THE SPEECH, **BROOKS** ATTACKED **SUMNER FROM BEHIND**, BEATING HIM WITH A WALKING STICK UNTIL HE WAS UNCONSCIOUS, LEAVING BLOOD EVERYWHERE!



SUMNER'S COLLEAGUES TRIED TO STOP BROOKS, BUT A REP. FROM SC, PULLED A PISTOL OUT TO HINDER THEM! DESPITE THIS, SUMNER'S FRIENDS SAVED HIS LIFE, RESTRAINING BROOKS.



IT TOOK **THREE YEARS** FOR SUMNER TO RECOVER. **THE STATE LEGISLATURE** WOULD VOTE HIM BACK INTO THE SENATE, THOUGH HE COULD NOT ATTEND SESSIONS FULL TIME. HIS EMPTY SEAT WOULD BECOME A SYMBOL OF **DEFIANCE AGAINST SLAVERY!**

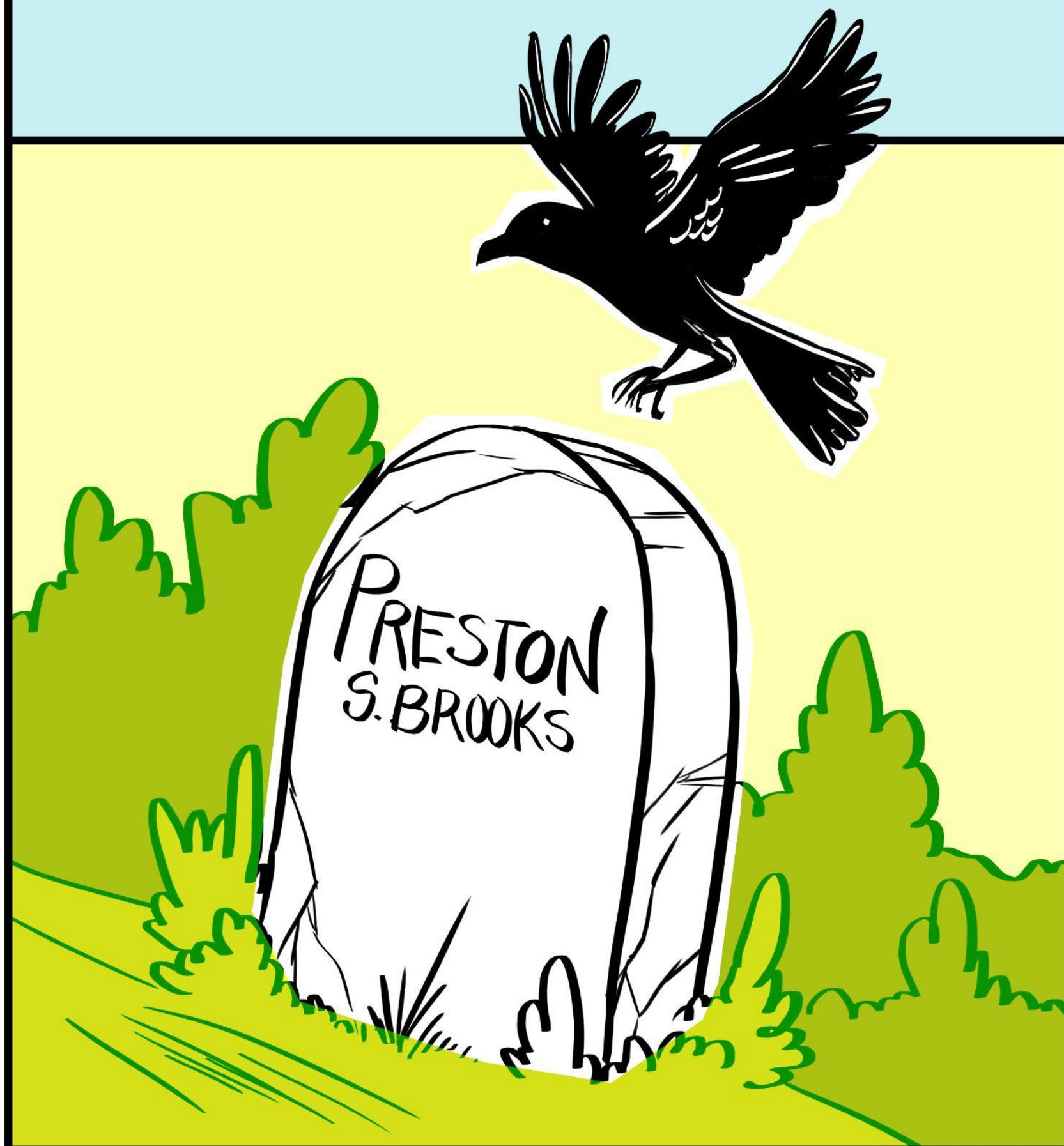
YOU ARE A CHAMPION TO OUR NEW
