

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR -

Easter (even when it is early on the calendar) is a time of transition. We move from the dull days of winter into a season of expectation and hopefulness. This year we have tried to look at the ways in which we celebrate Easter and think of new ways to approach it. Churches are doing a great job of stepping out into the community and finding new ways of being of service in Christ's name. We were never meant to remain behind the walls of the church building in worship. It is this image that has helped people to see the church as uncaring or judgmental rather than as communities devoted to finding solutions to problems in the family, community or even the world.

Some churches are joining together on celebration Sundays to find concrete ways that they can be in the community doing acts of service. In the process members see concrete ways that they can volunteer their time to accomplish goals for nonprofits organizations that reach out to the community. In many cases this is done as an alternative to the normal worship hour. It is strange that we have imagined that we can only be in a posture of worship if we find our way to the pew for an hour. God calls us to go out and be an active participant in the faith. As Christians we are challenged to rethink our understanding of worship. Can it take place in the workplace or at another location if we are open to his Spirit? I think that is true when it is done in the context of serving a covenant community.
