

The Berwick Food Co-Op continues at the church on Thursdays from 5:00 to 6:00 PM. There are varieties of baked goods from Panera Bread. Larry McCreery picks up Fareway products each week and Chuck Beyer picks up from Hy-Vee. There have also been generous gifts of canned goods, dry goods and cash to the Co-Op from members and friends of the church. The number of families being served has increased. We deliver to Norwoodville Community Center, Cornell Elementary, Hope Ministries and to about 17 individual families. Thanks to all who prepare and deliver all this food.

John McKinney and Rich continue to work at IMPACT on Friday mornings. Butch Bierman has now joined the team. The three pick up food and deliver to IMPACT. Pastor Kay continues to work on Tuesday afternoons with stocking shelves.

The Blessing Box near the church sign is being used steadily. It is filled every Thursday after the Co-Op closes. People have been taking what they need and some have been leaving food items. During the winter months, the Box has been stocked with cereals, Kleenex boxes, hygiene products, macaroni and cheese and hamburger helper. As soon as the weather warms up, canned goods will be added. On the top shelf of the Blessing Box are cookbooks for anyone who would like to have one.
