

# A CHRISTIAN MINISTRY IN NATIONAL PARKS— OUR MAY MISSION

A Christian Ministry in the National Parks (ACMNP) is a grassroots, student-led ministry based in Colorado that began in Yellowstone National Park in 1951 with the dream of providing Christian community for the people working in, living in, and visiting the first national park in the world.

Today, ACMNP lives its mission by sending roughly 200 ministry team members into 75 locations in 25 national parks from Alaska to the Virgin Islands. Over 30,000 people worship together in ACMNP services every year, experiencing the glory of God by seeing it first-hand — nothing compares to the inspiration that comes from worshipping God the Creator in the beautiful outdoors!

### UNION CHAPEL ON BERWICK DRIVE By Nelson Pearce

A few years ago, I found on the web an 1880 map of Polk County, Iowa. A beautiful piece of calligraphy by some forgotten surveyor, it shows a tiny, neatly-inked square for each house or other building, with names of settlers and schools.

Using the tools of modern times, I "cut" out and magnified a piece showing the "Greenwood Stage Stop" (now Berwick Drive & NE 78<sup>th</sup> Ave.), the village of Berwick and the areas between. Four Mile Creek with some woods and the railway from Berwick heading NE toward Bondurant are clearly drawn, as are roads, Berwick Cemetery and Yoders School (Now 62<sup>nd</sup> Ave and Fourmile Drive).

At Berwick Cemetery appears a larger inked square labelled "Union Chapel," the building now known as "Berwick Church." Built in 1875, there it was on the map, still new, freshly built and waiting for history to flow in, through and around it. Farm horses moved it in about 1898 to where it now sits in Berwick. Mines, farms, homes, have come and gone around it; still it remains. Wars, times of plenty and of need, wagons and autos and other marks of history have come and passed. The Union Chapel has served as both a shaper and a reflection of the history ever streaming by and through it.

So, too, have plagues come, wrought their death and misery, passed away and then been left behind as simply stories. So will pass the current plague. As passes all of history.

Beginning as an open-country feature and moving with history into the edge of a "metro," Union Chapel served the changing needs presented by time's ever-flowing stream. It still does.

Its builders could not know the people that this simple building, which their minds and hands had so well and durably wrought, would see and serve and save. They just knew they had to build it, and then to use it, as the history stream brought 'round new needs and purposes.

That's all they needed to know about Union Chapel - and all we need to know about it now.




