UKRAINE

Ecclesiastes 3:8b: "a time for war and a time for peace."

Luke 22:36b: "And let the one who has no sword sell his cloak and buy one." The Russian war against Ukraine is ever present in our daily thoughts. Wars tend to do that – to crowd out and occupy our attention in the midst of all else that is happening. A war has no equal in the affairs of humans when it comes to demanding attention.

In our world of instant information, it would be a waste of words in this article to describe the Ukraine war. But it is worth asking about its place in the life of Berwick (broadly meaning the Berwick community and the wider outreach of the church). Why, we may ask, is this happening in a world ordered by God? And how is it our problem? I believe the Ukrainians are us. The Berwick community has a life, a culture and a history. Berwick has children and working families with daily lives lived closely and caringly with each other. It has buildings, such as Berwick Church, and houses and schools and roads. It has Four Mile Creek and the Berwick Cemetery. We have all inherited this "Berwick" and we all grow Berwick anew each day as we live in it.

What if someone said to us, "You are nothing; you have nothing; you must all leave and everything you have built must be leveled to the ground." Having lived in the Berwick community for 62 years, one thing I know is that we are "scrappy." We sometimes "scrap" with each other, but are even more prone to help when others of us are in need, such as the church does with our food program. We care about each other and what we have. We would fight for each other, for our history and our future. We would resist.

As a church we can pray for peace. But I don't believe God will fault me for praying also for "peace through victory" for Ukraine, since the" peace" their aggressor wants is peace through death, driving the people out, kidnapping their children, erasing structures and records of their history. The "peace" of genocide.

To me it appears as "a time for war," and a time when we can place a sword in the hands of a people who want only to have a future decided by them, and not by Vladimir Putin.
