



# **Advancement Notes**

I hope had a wonderful Christmas and New Years. Winter Camp is a great opportunity to earn merit badges. Also, for scouts working on rank advancements to hold Scoutmaster Conferences and Board of Reviews. Note that Winter Camp will be held at Camp Holy Wild on January 15-17, 2021 which goes from Saturday through Monday. Note that Monday is a school holiday. Our next Court of Honor (COH) is February 14, 2022 (Valentine's Day). All Rank and Merit Badge information will need to be completed by January 31, 2021 to be recognized at this COH. On January 2, 2022, new parents that did not have access to Troopmaster before were given access. This permits you to see your scouts Troopmaster records via a computer or your cell phone. This will be mostly a read only access, but does permit the parent to update their personal information and their scout's using the computer access. You should have received an email from me, CarlTorres.TM2739@troopmaster.email entitled "Troopmaster Web Account Settings" on January 2, 2022. If you are a new parent to the Troop this year and did not receive an email entitle above, please contact me at Advancement@troop839.com. It maybe that I do not have your email in the system. The new scouts will, in the future, get access to their information as well. If the Scout does not have an email address the information will be sent their parent. The scout account will be read only access but they will be able to review their scout digital data via a computer or their cell phone. - 3. Contact the merit badge Counselor.
- 4. Begin work on the merit badge.
- 5. Review with the Counselor.

- Finish the merit badge.
- 7. Review with the merit badge Counselor.
- 8. Obtain the Scoutmaster's signature.
- 9. Turn in the signed blue card to Mr. Torres.
- 10. Received the merit badge.
