Tribal Transportation Program (TTP)

This summer and fall there will be construction of a new sidewalk along 12th street, Howkan street and 13th street. The sidewalk will be from Haugen Street to Tlingit and Haida Housing (intersection of Howkan and 13th street). This project will address oedestrian safety issues in a high traffic area.

TTP maintenance has been working on trail maintenance of the Hungry Point gravel trail and snow removal around fire hydrants. This spring TTP will be blading Forest Service roads and after completion will begin construction of the Mountain View Manor boardwalk.

The PIA Paratransit bus continues operation daily from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. This bus service is offered to the general public age 60 years or older and persons with disabilities. The service area for the bus is between Sandy Beach Park and Scow Bay Loop Road. The service is free to the rider and caregiver. Tribal Comprehensive Plan Update

The plan addresses five priorities identified by the Tribe, which include childcare, culture revitalization, affordable housing, job training and education, and drug and alcohol treatment. Staff has been holding community meetings, talking with community organizations and reaching out directly to Tribal Citizens to get their input. The goal is to create a document that will guide the Tribe for years to come!

Native households are at risk of being under counted in the 2020 Census. Alaska Natives have been under counted for decades. Many programs that benefit the Native community are funded based on census-driven data. It is vital that Native households participate in the census.



the festivities!

An under count of our state in 2020 means Alaska will not receive its full share of federal funding for the next 10 years. In the face of increasing state and local budget constraints, we cannot afford an under count in 2020.

The Native American or Alaska Native in the home must be listed as head of household. Failure to do so will result in less funding for your community and programs such as Head Start, WIC, TANF, and SNAP!
