New USBC Rules and Specifications

Static weight and balance holes. Balance holes were intended to bring the static weight of the ball within specifications of no more than 1 ounce of Finger/thumb and side weight. USBC has increased the static weight difference to 3 oz for all balls weighing over 10 pounds, beginning Aug 1, 2018. This eliminates the need for almost all weight holes. All balls with weight holes will be legal to be used until Jul 31, 2020. On Aug 1, 2020, no balls will be allowed to have weight holes, but balls with weight holes must meet the 1oz static weight rule. Bowlers now have a two-year window to work with their pro shops to ensure their equipment will meet specifications on Aug. 1, 2020. All gripping holes on all balls must be used on every release. If a bowler only uses fingers and no thumb, the thumb hole must be plugged, and an "X" must be etched in the ball and the hand must cover the X to be a legal release. Since house balls are not drilled for specific bowlers, they are exempt from the weight hole rule.

The Dry towel rule. Any kind of dry towel, shammy or other types of towel may be used during play. No liquids may be used on the ball during play. If some foreign matter gets stuck on the ball that cannot be rubbed off by a dry towel, then the tournament manager or league officer can allow enough liquid to remove the foreign matter, the same as a damaged ball.

Ball absorption rule for manufacturers. The oil absorption rate is reduced, so there will no longer be balls that will dry up the line as fast and force you to move as quickly or change balls. All balls currently in use by bowlers will continue to be legal.
