Review ATV/UTV routes on County Roads within the Town of Tomah

Mike Pierce was present to answer any questions the board may have had on proposed routes within the town for this year. The three routes that effect the Town Of Tomah are:

1. County A between Irondale Ave and Holiday Road.
2. County A from Juneau Road to Holiday Road.
3. County CA from Hiawatha Avenue to Holiday Road.

Randie Johns made a motion to recommend approval of the 3 above stated routes to the County Highway Commission. Al Bartels seconded the motion. The motion carried.

In order for Route #2 to be approved, the Town would have to open Juneau Rd as an ATV/UTV route. Randie Johns made a motion to open Juneau Road from County A to the intersection with Juneberry Road, at the Town of Wilton line. Al Bartels seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Review proposed County Zoning changes

Next Monday night, February 19, the Zoning Commission for the County will meet to approve changes to chapter 47 of the Zoning Code. The board discussed the changes and has no problems with the revisions.

Bridge weight limit posting per the DOT

The WI DOT has determined that 2 bridges need to have weight limits changed. The Hiawatha Avenue Bridge will be changed from 20 Ton to 25 Ton. The Interior Avenue Bridge will go from not being posted to having a weight limit of 25 Ton. The county has already posted the signage on the Interior Avenue Bridge.

Monthly bills were reviewed and approved.
