Monthly Board Meeting

The clerk's report was read. Randie Johns made a motion to accept the clerk's report. Allan Bartels seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The treasurer's report was read. Allan Bartels made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Randie Johns seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Public Comment

- Howard Hanson discussed the recently released equalized evaluation for the town.
- Ernie Thackeray asked for an introduction of the supervisors on the board, and an explanation on how the board works.
- Todd Sparks asked for breakdown of expenses, and details on the new voting machine the town had to buy, along with internet security and safety of voting results and information.
- It was requested to have the meeting agendas placed on the door.
- Mark Nicholson was present to introduce himself as the county supervisor for the town.

Redistricting for Monroe County

- Redistricting is done every 10 years to try and keep the population represented by each supervisory district equal.
- Mark Nicholson made a suggestion as a town tax payer, to hold off on approving the redistricting because there is information that the census numbers may not be correct. Al Bartels made a motion to table approval of the resolution for redistricting. Randie Johns seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Monroe County Zoning Fee Restructuring

- There will be some increases to the fees, but the changes will make it easier to figure the costs for permits. Howard Hanson made a motion to approve the restructuring fees. Randie Johns seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Tomah Area Ambulance Commission Meeting

- Tim Adler reviewed the last year for the Ambulance Commission
- He recommended a \$2.50/per capita increase in fees, which will make the total fee \$15/per capita
- Financially, the Commission is at roughly the same status as last year, they did purchase a new ambulance.

- There is no location designated for the new ambulance building, so progress has stalled.

Monthly bills were reviewed and approved.

A motion was made by Randie Johns to adjourn the meeting. Allan Bartels seconded the motion. The motion carried.
